share his observations about the cross cutting spirit of service that drives the passion of staff and volunteers across the globe.




26th batch of Health Promotion through Yoga and Ayurveda commences

Republic Day - A snapshot

As the nation observed its 70th Republic Day on 26th January, Indian Red Cross Society marked the day with branches across the country hosting and participating in various events. These ranged from organising blood donation camps to participation in formal ceremonies. As the largest statutory humanitarian organisation in the country, Indian Red Cross volunteers, including Junior and Youth Red Cross members, and First Aid teams were deployed at event venues and participated in various ceremonial processions. Updates from Branches

Kerala: Flood Recovery

Response



A joint field team from Qatar Red Crescent Society (QRCS) and the Indian Red Cross Society has finished an assessment visit to the flood-affected areas of Kerala. The assessment is aimed at initiating the recovery phase. Between June 1 and August 18 last year, Kerala experienced the worst floods since 1924. During this period, the state received cumulative rainfall that was 42% in excess of the normal average. IRCS has been responding since the onset of the floods in early August 2018 and has moved from rescue to recovery phase.
