

Standardization of colour, pattern and specifications of relief distribution material



In order to enhance the visibility and impact of relief measures undertaken by Indian Red Cross Society, need was felt to standardise specifications of various relief items and dress of the Red Cross staff & volunteers engaged in relief, manning Red Cross posts, rehabilitation and other work. It is also felt that IRCS also needs to fix some colour combinations for all its relief materials; be it tents, tarpaulin, mats/daris, saris, gents dhotis, buckets etc. While the colour combination will be same, the pattern may vary from product to product. But the pattern will be the same for the same item.

In view of the above, an exercise is being done at IRCS, NHQ to come out with all possible colour combinations and patterns.

Views from State branches, National Managing Body members and movement partners have been invited on the various options.

Based on response, final standard color and patterns shall be finalized.
