INDIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY: AN INTRODUCTION

The Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) is a vibrant, voluntary humanitarian organization with a nationwide network of over 1200 branches. Mission of IRCS is to bring relief during disasters and emergencies and to promote health and care for the most vulnerable individuals and communities. As a proud member of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, which includes the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC), and 191 National Societies, we adhere to the seven Fundamental Principles of the Movement.

A Legacy of Service

Established in 1920 under the Indian Red Cross Society Act and incorporated under Parliament Act XV of 1920, IRCS has a rich legacy. The Hon'ble President of India is our President, while traditionally the Hon'ble Union Health Minister is our Chairman. Governance and supervision is managed by our National Managing Body, which consists of 19 members, including the Chairman. Six members, along with the Chairman, are nominated by the President, while the remaining 12 are elected through an electoral college.

Our Mission

Our mission is to inspire, encourage, and initiate humanitarian efforts to alleviate suffering and foster a more peaceful world. We are committed to providing humanitarian and charitable services, such as medical relief, healthcare, blood services, first aid, disaster risk reduction, and other ancillary services to prevent and mitigate suffering without discrimination based on nationality, race, caste, sex, religious beliefs, language, class, or political opinion.

What We Do

Here's a glimpse of the crucial services and initiatives we undertake:

- **Emergency Relief:** We provide immediate relief to victims of disasters and work tirelessly to mitigate their suffering.
- Blood Services: Our blood donation camps and services are vital for saving lives.
- Ambulance Services: We offer prompt and reliable ambulance services.
- Healthcare Initiatives: We focus on improving health, preventing disease, and providing maternity, childcare, and care to elderly.
- **Training and Capacity Building:** We train and build the capacity of our volunteers and staff to ensure effective service delivery.
- Youth Engagement: We actively promote youth participation in our activities, nurturing the next generation of humanitarian leaders.
- **Promoting Principles:** We advocate the Fundamental Principles of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement.
- **Global Representation:** We represent Society at international Red Cross statutory platforms and other fora.
- **Peace Efforts:** We strive towards establishing and maintaining global peace.
- Medical & other Aid to Armed Forces: We provide aid to sick, wounded, or demobilized members of the Armed Forces, in line with the Geneva Conventions of 12th August 1949.

- **Preparedness and Response:** We act in times of armed conflict and prepare to respond to all tasks covered under the Geneva Conventions during peacetime.
- We work as auxiliary to government in its humanitarian work.

At IRCS, we are dedicated to making a positive impact on society by alleviating suffering and contributing to a peaceful and hospitable environment for all.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Overview of Our Activities and Achievements in Disaster Mitigation, Response, and Recovery (2023-2024)

Welcome to our annual review! Here's a snapshot of what we've achieved together in the areas of disaster mitigation, response, and recovery over the past year.

Emergency Response

This year, IRCS jumped into action to tackle several emergencies across the country, both manmade & natural in which our dedicated teams worked tirelessly to provide:

- Shelter: Safe and secure temporary housing for displaced families.
- Food and Water: Nutritious meals and clean drinking water.
- Sanitation: Hygienic facilities to prevent disease outbreaks.
- **Health Services**: Medical care and support for those in need.

Building Capacity

Red Cross work doesn't stop at emergency response. We're also dedicated to making communities stronger and more resilient. Here's how we did it:

- **Disaster Preparedness Training**: Conducted sessions to help communities understand and prepare for potential disasters.
- **Community-Based First Aid**: Trained individuals to provide immediate care in emergencies, saving lives before professional help arrives.
- **Psychosocial Support**: Offered training to help communities cope with the emotional and psychological impacts of disasters.

These efforts are all about empowering individuals and communities to face future challenges with confidence and resilience.

A. Disaster Response

The monsoon arrived in the country in June 2023, bringing heavy rainfall. During the year floods, cyclones, cold waves and fires impacted several states. The disaster response to the 16 IRCS state branches—namely Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Delhi, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Maharashtra, Manipur, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, and West Bengal—was coordinated with the respective state branches. These branches promptly responded to the disasters, dispatching relief materials from existing stock in various warehouses.

B. Supplies received in-kind from IFRC, Canadian Red Cross & ICRC under Foreign donation for FY 2023-24

During the financial year 2023-24, IRCS NHQ received supplies (Annexure-1) worth INR 16,41,06,010 (Approx.) with support from IFRC, ICRC and other partner National Societies. The supplies include 13 no. of vehicles (i.e. Blood Collection Vans-11 & Mobile Health Units-2), tarpaulins (39,985 Nos.), woolen Blankets (14,000 Nos.), Hygiene Kits (20,000 Nos.) and Kitchen Sets (9,450 Nos). These supplies had been delivered to the IRCS State/UT branches & IRCS Warehouses.

C. <u>Disaster Response Emergency Fund (DREF) Operation</u>

The state of Himachal Pradesh was the hardest hit, with at least 330 people lost their lives, 38 missing and more than 100 injured during flood, several districts experienced an entire month's worth of rainfall within a single day. In Manali, roads were swept away by the deluge, leaving both tourists and their vehicles stranded. Over the weekend of August 12-13, 2023, additional torrential rains hit Shimla, triggering landslides and destroying a temple, homes, and buildings, and killing at least 57 people. The landslides washed out several roads, The additional floods and landslides killed a total of 71 people. A massive landslide destroyed roads and buildings in the city of Shimla. Cumulatively, since the monsoon hit on June 24,170 incidents of cloudburst or landsliding were reported and 9,600 houses were damaged in Himachal Pradesh. The Himachal Pradesh State Red Cross Society rendered its services with the volunteers to serve the affected community. The State Branch provided relief individually as well as with its district Red Cross branches the relief items were provided under DREF Operation to the most affected communities in the state.

During the monsoon season, massive landslides wreaked havoc on roads and buildings in Chamoli, Rudraprayag, Pithoragarh, Bageshwar, Pauri Garhwal, and Uttarkashi in Uttarakhand State. The Uttarakhand State Red Cross Society, along with its District branches and volunteers, provided assistance to the affected community, encompassing more than 1,200 families. The Indian Red Cross Society's state branch and district branches distributed tarpaulins, blankets, kitchen sets, hygiene kits, and other essential items to support the affected families.

In view of the above situation, the IRCS, National Headquarter had implemented DREF Operation through IFRC in the two IRCS State Branches i.e. Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand. The total fund was available CHF 5,39,063 (including procurement handled by IFRC).

The following relief items (worth INR 3,18,45,616.93) were distributed by the IRCS Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand Branches under the DREF Operation 2023: -

D. Pre-positioning of 1450 Nos of Kitchen sets

IRCS, NHQ procured 1450 Nos of kitchen sets (725 each for Assam and Bihar) during FY 2023-24 from IFRC Google supported project left over funds.

E. Major Disaster Responses



➤ On 12 November 2023, a section of the Silkyara Bend–Barkot tunnel, planned to connect National Highway 134 in the Uttarkashi district of Uttarakhand, India, caved in while under construction. The collapse occurred at around 05:30 IST and trapped 41 workers inside the tunnel. Rescue operations were immediately launched, with several government agencies. IRCS supported the local authorities in the rescue operation and provided necessary support to the staff.

F. Train Accidents

Balasore train accident

Howrah bound Coromandel Express collided with a stationary goods train in Balasore district, Odisha, derailing most of its coaches. The devastating train accident in Odisha shook the nation, leaving behind a trail of devastation and grief. However, amidst the tragedy, the incident sparked an extraordinary display of compassion and solidarity across India. IRCS volunteers from nearby areas of Balasore provided immediate assistance in rescue operations. Sh. Jacob Kispotta, Commandant NDRF appreciated IRCS volunteers for their support. At the Vishakhapatnam railway station, volunteers from Visakhapatnam district branch of A.P Red Cross state branch distributed buttermilk, cookies, buns, water bottles along with the paracetamol tablets, pain killers and relief sprays amongst the victims of Balasore train accident. The victims were taken from Balasore to Chennai by train. Volunteers from Youth Red Cross KIIT stepped forward to donate blood for the victims of this train accident.

The fatal train accident in Andhra Pradesh where precious lives have been lost. Volunteers from the IRCS state branches were actively involved in delivering aid to accident victims and assisting the local authorities in relief and rescue efforts. Vishakhapatnam YRC volunteers had rushed to the train accident spot near Kothavalasa and participated in rescue operations. Vizianagaram district branch sent ambulances and hundreds of YRC volunteers.



BLOOD SERVICES

The Blood Services of the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) continued to be a significant area of focus during the year 2023-24. The program played a crucial role in ensuring adequate supply of safe blood and blood products to patients in need, particularly during disasters or any other crisis.

Transfusion of blood is an essential part of modern health care management. IRCS has a robust blood processing and testing infrastructure, with over 100 blood centres across 15 States/ UTs and blood storage centers across the country. During the year, IRCS continued to invest in modernizing its blood processing and testing facilities, ensuring the safety and quality of blood and blood products.

The Blood Centre is running round the clock and provides services to the needy patients. It was designated as Regional Blood Centre by State Govt. in 1996 and has been designated as Model Blood Bank in 2010 by National AIDS Control Organization, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India and is Certified by the BIS for ISO 9001:2015 and accredited by NABH & NABL.

This Blood Centre focuses on encouraging voluntary blood donation. It collects approximately 30,000 units of blood annually. The percentage of voluntary blood collection is 100% in IRCS Blood Centre. The Blood Centre provides about 70% of total collection of blood free of service charges to the patients admitted in Govt. Hospitals in Delhi, HIV/AIDS patients, patients below poverty line, thalassaemia patients, haemophilia patients and sickle cell anemia patients. 900 thalassaemic patients are registered with IRCS, NHQ (which is about 50% of all the thalassaemics in Delhi).

The IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre is fully equipped to collect blood at its premises and also has mobile teams, which go out frequently to hold Blood Donation Camps. The blood, after collection, is tested for HIV I & II, HBs Ag, HCV, VDRL & Malaria. Blood grouping with Rh D and Antibodies Testing (three cell panel) is done by fully automated advance technology. To ensure effective utilization of blood, besides supplying whole blood, Red Cross also has the facility of component separation that provides different components of blood, like fresh frozen plasma, platelet rich plasma, platelet concentrate, packed cells, cryoprecipitate and platelet aphaeresis.

A. Blood Donation Camps

IRCS continued to organize blood donation camps with safety measures in place to protect donors and staff. These camps were critical in maintaining an adequate supply of blood and blood products for patients in need. IRCS also collaborated with corporate partners and other organizations to organize blood donation drives, resulting in an increase in the number of donors.

Highlights of major camps: -

- 1188 blood donors were provided by Sant Nirankari Mandal in 10 camps.
- Blood Donation Camp was organized at Parliament House on 13th December, 2023 to mark the 18th Commemoration Day of the supreme sacrifice made by Security Personnel on the

altar of duty while thwarting the attack of terrorists on Parliament House on 13-12-2001. **106** people paid homage to the departed souls and saluted their martyrdom by donating blood voluntarily, including the family members of those martyred.

 IRCS organized blood donation camps and drive awareness programes under Ayushman Bhav Campaign (17th Sept. to 2nd Oct., 23). During this period, IRCS, Blood Centre collected a total number of 1034 units of blood from 21 voluntary blood donation camps.



 IRCS, NHQ Blood Centre participated in the Health Mela organized by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University at Talkatora Stadium from 5th to 10th October, 2023 to mark its



Silver Jubilee Celebrations. IRCS, NHQ, Blood Centre provided Mobile Blood Donation Van for Blood Donation Camp and managed a stall in collaboration with the Blood Transfusion Service (BTS). IRCS, Blood Centre also provided volunteers for the stall and IEC materials including standee, backdrop, and posters on blood donation awareness in Health Mela. Blood Donation Camp was conducted on alternate days by IRCS, Blood Centre and RML Hospital where mobile van of

IRCS, NHQ Blood Centre was stationed. In this Health Mela 252 donors were registered in E- raktkosh and out of them 164 donors donated their blood voluntarily.

 Indian Red Cross Society, NHQ, Blood Centre organized a blood donation camp in Supreme Court of India on 'Swami Vivekananda Jayanti' on 12th January 24. The Chief Justice of India, Hon'ble Dhananjaya Y. Chandrachud inaugurated the blood donation camp. 81 people from Supreme Court of India voluntarily donated blood in the camp.



- A total number of 515 units were collected from the voluntary donors in a camp conducted in BITS, Pilani, Rajasthan, from 2nd to 5th Feb. 2024. This has been an annual feature for the last 3 decades.
- During Dengue Viral Haemorrhagic fever the demand for platelets increased manifolds.
 IRCS, NHQ Blood Centre organised 60 blood donation camps and 2977 units of lifesaving platelet concentrate was prepared and issued to both Government and Private hospitals in and around Delhi round the clock for patients.
- A total of 539 blood donors were provided by JBM (Neel Foundation) in 03 camps organized by them.

- During the year 2023-24, 48769 total Blood/Blood components were prepared. 14714
 units of blood components were issued free of cost to the patients admitted in
 Government Hospitals, thalassaemic and haemophilic patients.
- **13643** units of blood were issued against processing charges to the patients admitted in private hospitals/ nursing homes.
- During the year 2023-24, Blood Centre, Indian Red Cross Society at National Headquarter collected a total of 21344 units of blood from voluntary blood donors. A total of 368 Blood Donation Camps were conducted in various places like Educational Institutions, Corporate offices, Religious/Social Organizations.

B. Screening, Processing & Storage of Blood

Blood is tested for infectious diseases (TTIs) such as HIV, HBs Ag, VDRL & HCV and blood group serology. The screening of Transfusion Transmitted Infectious Marker (TTIs) is done by ELISA Method.

C. Other Beneficiaries of Blood Centre (NHQ) to whom blood components are issued (2023-24)

- a) Thalassemia: In Delhi, there are about 2000 registered thalassemic patients who are receiving blood from various Regional Centers like AIIMS, RML Hospital, Hindu Rao Hospital, LNJP Hospital, GTB Hospital and private blood banks. Out of them 975 patients are registered with Red Cross Blood Centre and more than 200 registered patients are from outside Delhi. IRCS continues to look after approx. 50% of the thalassemic patients residing in and around Delhi and provides Blood/Blood Components to them.
- b) Support to National Plasma Fractionation Centre (NPFC): IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre is a NACO supported blood component Separation Unit. As per NACO guidelines IRCS, Blood Centre has largely supported Reliance Life Sciences Pvt. Ltd. by sending the surplus Plasma/FFP for fractionation. In the year 2023-24, IRCS (NHQ), Blood Centre has issued about 19150 units of surplus plasma/FFP to Reliance Life Sciences Pvt. Ltd.

D. Accreditation

Certificate of accreditation for ISO by BIS, NABH and NABL: The IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre has been certified by IS/ISO 9001:2015, NABH and NABL w.e.f 2012 and 2013. Routine surveillance audit for the accreditation has been conducted by the auditor team in 2023-24 by BIS, NABL and NABH for renewal of accreditation.

- **E.** External Quality Assurance Programme (EQAS) IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre has been enrolled with SDMH, Jaipur (BEQAS), CMC Vellore, AIIMS and Mumbai Red Cross for proficiency for infectious marker and serology testing.
- **F.** <u>Training:</u> Trainings were provided by IRCS (NHQ), Blood Centre to doctors, lab. technicians of Govt. hospitals and interns from different institutions to enrich their knowledge on overview of procedures for testing in blood services, safety parameters & transfusion quality management system (TQMS). The visit facilitates the Blood Centres in strengthening the standards of Blood Services which were learnt during the training period and spreads awareness while enlightening the students for blood donations.

Training was imparted on Automated Cell counter, Automated Blood grouping technique, transfusion transmitted infections (TTIs), ADR monitoring, Blood component preparation, Plasma components and documentation of processes.

I. IFRC Support for Strengthening the IRCS, Blood Centers

Strengthening of the Red Cross Blood Centres existing across the country, IRCS, NHQ issued guidelines, to the State Branches to strengthen the Blood Centre. A part of IFRC Fund of INR 164 Cr was used for supplying essential equipment to the existing 100 Blood Centres including 22 new Blood Centres. The equipment were procured, delivered and installed by IFRC in consultation with IRCS, NHQ Blood Centre.

During 2023-24, being a continuous process, the equipment was delivered and installed at all existing and new blood centres. The request of State Branches / Blood Centre to shift the equipment from one blood centre to other blood centre was monitored by the IRCS NHQ.

As we look ahead, IRCS's Blood Services program will continue to focus on expanding blood donation camps and drives, strengthening of our blood processing and testing facilities, and enhancing our community awareness and education programs. We will also work to improve access to blood and blood products for underserved communities across the country. Details of the blood services conducted by the branches are included in the summarized reports of the State/UT Branches.

FUND RAISING & MEMBERSHIP

Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) got the support of its donors, partners and others to support its programs and services during the year. The fundraising and membership activities of IRCS played a vital role in ensuring the sustainability of the organization. The Indian Red Cross Society sources its funds for the welfare activities through various channels. FIRST AID TRAINING

The First Aid training program of the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) continued to be an area of focus during the year 2023-24. The program played a crucial role in building the capacity of individuals and communities to respond effectively to emergencies and disasters.

IRCS, NHQ has been making efforts to streamline the trainings in first aid being held all through the country by the branches. One of the initiatives has been to hold examinations in online mode instead of offline mode for evaluating the competency of the trainees.

Online First Aid/Home Nursing & allied subjects Examination of IRCS & St John (I)



First Aid, Home Nursing and allied courses trainings are imparted to the general public and to aerodrome staff, drivers & conductors, armed forces, police, mines & factories staff, NCC, civil defence, home guard, railway employees, teachers and students. 8 days training (minimum 16 hours) is mandatory for professional certificates before taking the First Aid examination. This First Aid certificate is mandatory for some streams of jobs in government sector. The first aid trainings for employees in the corporate sector can be of a minimum of 3 days with a minimum training of 16 hours.

The pilot phase of online examination project was started in Delhi, Punjab, and Haryana in the year 2022 and has been successfully implemented. The key features are as follows:

- 1. Online registration of candidates (Individual/Corporate & Student)
- 2. Online payment on final registration
- 3. Online creation of batches by Training Centres & provision to select batch by the candidates.
- 4. Centralized attendance recording and calculation for qualifying for examination based on attendance.
- 5. Multilingual question paper based on the level of examination.
- 6. Theory examinations on tabs provided by the vendor who is responsible for providing infrastructure for examination.
- 7. Practical examination by the Training Centre examiner and marks to be given on tab itself.
- 8. Immediate release of result
- 9. Certificate generation after 5 days of examination

IRCS-ICRC COOPERATION ACTIVITY

The IRCS- ICRC supported programmes and activities to disseminate correct and proper use of Red Cross Emblem to minimise its misuse; awareness programmes on Fundamental Principles, First Aid, Junior & Youth Red Cross Program, Digital transformation and Family News Service program.

During the year the IRCS-ICRC cooperation activity covered twelve states and NHQ to conduct following activities: -

- First Aid training
- Youth Program
- Restoring family link (RFL services)
- Emergency prepositioning
- Digital transformation
- Family News Service

The programme is currently being implemented in the following states: Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Jammu & Kashmir, Odisha, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, IRCS National Headquarter. <u>The total budget for the ICRC-supported programme is ₹55,379,104.</u>

A. Master trainers in first aid

IRCS imparts training in First Aid for the benefit of general public and employees of companies, factories, corporates and others through its branches. The trainings are imparted by Instructors/Lay Lecturers authorized by the National Headquarters for this purpose. The Instructors/Lay Lecturers are assessed for their efficiency periodically by Master Trainers deputed by the National

Headquarters. Master Trainers are selected by the National Headquarters from among the Instructors/ Lay Lecturers based on their extra ability and mastery over the subject.

These Kendras shall be run by the Indian Red Cross Society.

STATUTORY MEETINGS OF IRCS (NHQ)

a) Annual General Meeting at Rashtrapati Bhavan



The Hon'ble President of India and Indian Red Cross Society, Smt. Draupadi Murmu, graced the ceremonial session of the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) on 17th July, 2023 at the Rashtrapati Bhawan Cultural Centre. More than 300 delegates from across the nation participated.

The AGM was held in the physical presence of Governors and Lieutenant Governors from nine states and Union Territories, while several others joined virtually. Hon'ble President of India felicitated the best performing Red Cross State and UT branches and distinguished Red Crossers for their outstanding contribution to the Indian Red Cross Society. A total of seven awards in three different categories were presented.





The Business Session was presided over by Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, Hon'ble Chairman of IRCS and Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare and Chemicals & Fertilizers, Gol. He gave merit certificates to 6 distinguished Red Crossers. He stated that IRCS may win the Nobel Peace Prize for its work. He exhorted Red Crossers to work towards it to fulfill this cherished award. He went on to say,

"Health is not a commerce in India; it is a service in India," emphasising that service is more than just a phrase; it is our culture, and the Red Cross can do a lot in the sphere of service to mankind.

Presentation of Awards

Hon'ble President conferred Red Cross Gold Medal upon Dr. LN Ambati Natraj from Telangana and Dr. Goparaju Samaram from Andhra Pradesh. IRCS, Odisha State branch was given a shield for raising maximum funds and IRCS Jammu & Kashmir UT Branch was given a shield for raising maximum funds in relation to its population for the year 2021-22 amongst the UT Branches. Gujarat State branch and Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu, UT branch received Blood Donation Shields for highest voluntary blood collection.

b) Project BHISHM

Project BHISHM is a joint project of the Indian Navy and the DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organisation) to develop a world-class hospital in disaster affected areas. The heart of



this innovative disaster hospital lies in its 72 cubes, each of which contain an array of essential equipment and supplies. On 5th January the Bheeshma Cube was brought to the Constitution Club, New Delhi. IRCS Vice Chairman, Sh. Anant Pandhare and Managing Body Members; Dr. Senjam Sunil Singh, Sh. Shivdular Singh Dhillon & Dr. Arumalla Sridhar Reddy, Secretary General Sh. R.K Jain, Joint

Secretary, Dr. Anoop Kumar Puri, Dr. Vanshree Singh, Director, IRCS Blood Center and officials of IRCS, IFRC & ICRC attended the demo session.

The cube has an operation theatre, a mini-ICU, ventilators, blood test equipment, an X-ray machine, a cooking station, food, water, shelter, a power generator, and other facilities. These 72 cubes contain almost everything needed for the survival of 100 patients for a period of 48 hours. It can treat more than 200 patients at a time.



c) Press Institute of India and ICRC Annual Media Awards 2023



Deputy Secretary, IRCS, NHQ Sh. N.K Singh attended 17th edition of the Press Institute of India and ICRC Annual Media Awards at Indian Habitat Centre, New Delhi on 24th Nov 2023. The awards were given for the best article and best photograph on a humanitarian subject. The theme for 2023 was stories of resilience in humanitarian disasters, response and challenges. The inaugural address was given by Mr. Kedir Awol Omar, HOD, ICRC. Sh. Rajendra Ratnoo, Executive Director of NIDM was the special guest. The panellists

included; Dinesh. C. Sharma, senior journalist and author, Gayatri Ramanathan, Journalist and communications professional, Urvashi Sarkar, Journalist and author, Surinder Oberoi, Senior Journalist, Divya Pushkarna, Disinformation Advisor, Medecins Sans Frontieres, Marie-Servane Desjongueres, Senior Communications Advisor, ICRC.

YOUTH PROGRAM

a) Background

IRCS NHQ and branches have been running Junior and Youth Red Cross activities since 1925. Juniors are the students in the schools registered under the program. Similarly, Youth are the members that are enrolled through their colleges registered by the Red Cross branches at the local level. The program has a very large membership as most of the Govt. run schools are covered. This is one of the important Red Cross activities throughout the world.

IRCS injected fresh life into the Youth Program with the support of ICRC in schools/colleges and communities in the selected States. The target states for this program were Maharashtra, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Telangana and Jammu & Kashmir.

This program has three key objectives -

- To enhance the understanding of the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement and its Fundamental Principles.
- Promote peace and harmony among the youth and the selected communities.
- To strengthen the capacity of the YRC regarding hygiene promotion, household water treatment, basic first- aid and promote peace and harmony in society.
- To contribute towards increasing the awareness on role of youth and behavioral changes in the selected communities on hygiene promotion, household water treatment and basic first aid.

b) Several activities were undertaken during the FY 23-24 in State/UT branches

i. IRCS Gujarat State Branch had organized 25 CPR training courses in different colleges to strengthen Youth Volunteers.





Felicitation of College Principal and Youth Counsellor: -

There were more than 5000 colleges joined the youth Red Cross Program. Principal and Counsellors were felicitated for joining humanitarian activity of Red Cross.







ii. <u>Junior Red Cross/Youth Red Cross camps were held in several districts of J&K-UT branch</u>



iii. YRC Volunteers Capacity Building Program; The IRCS, Odisha State Branch, held a cleanliness effort on Gandhi Jayanti, October 2, 2023. Govindpur Higher Secondary School volunteers visited the nearest adopted village, Sitala, and attended a session at the U.P School. All U.P School students were taught the best hand washing methods.

The District Level Orientation Program was held at Puri, Cuttack & Kendra Pará districts of Odisha under the Red Cross Youth Program.





On September 10, 2023, DKN College Eranch, Cuttack hosted a district-level orientation function on its campus. In addition to D.K.N College volunteers, chosen volunteers from U.N Autonomous College and Govindpur Higher Secondary School attended the orientation course. On the same day, Sastri Smurti Degree College held a program on its campus, in which volunteers from the other two selected colleges participated.

HEALTH PROGRAMS

1. TB Project:

a) **TB Mitra Program:** In India there are around 30,00,000 TB patients out of which 10 lakhs have given consent to share their personal details to receive kits under this program. The details of those patients can be shared with IRCS based on availability of donor and assurance that details will be treated confidentially and used only for the purpose of distribution of kit and rations.

During the year 2023-2024, nearly 32,000 nos. of TB patients were supported by registering donors. TB Patients were adopted by 16 state/UT branches (Arunachal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, Gujarat, Goa, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Nagaland, Punjab, and Uttarakhand, Utta Pradesh).

b) Prevention & Management of Tuberculosis including MDR-TB

TB is one of India's major public health problems. According to WHO estimates, India has the world's largest number of tuberculosis patients. Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) is playing an increasingly important role in ensuring that TB cases are treated successfully and find out ways & means to minimize stigma and discrimination against patients. With the aim to reduce the burden of MDR TB, IRCS addresses needs of the vulnerable people, arrange for the retreatment of patients and engages with those patients who are likely to default. While undergoing treatment these patients are being followed up and supported to enable full adherence to DOTs. Since 2009, IRCS has been working in support of TB patient in targeted communities in some states.

During the year 2023-2024, nearly 1200 patients were covered in the project districts in the states of Gujarat, Haryana and Punjab with the adherence rate of above 95%. The project covered awareness meetings, care and support patients counselling, IEC activities & discussion sessions at the government health facilities at their TB units & door to door services. Health checkups & TB screening camps were also organized.

Goal and Objectives:

- To ensure that Category II TB patients, i.e. those who have stopped DOTs treatment without completion, are put back on treatment until they are cured.
- To ensure effectiveness of treatment by providing care and nutritional support to the most vulnerable TB cases.
- Prevention of Multi Drug Resistant TB.
- To reduce the number of deaths, illness and impact from Tuberculosis and MDR TB in target areas.
- To reduce the stigma and discrimination around TB through behavior change communication campaign and inclusion of TB patients in important fora.

<u>Haryana</u>: The TB programme was extended in the year 2023-2024 under which a target of 300 TB patients was kept in the districts of Faridabad and Palwal. During the year 2023-2024, 446 TB patients were enrolled in Faridabad & Palwal district, out of which 261 were cured, 6 transferred out, 2 failures, 07 deaths and 170 were under treatment as on 31st March 2023.

Proper attention was paid on awareness activities during the year. In this regard, 26 advocacy awareness meetings and 107 Mohalla Meetings were arranged in Faridabad & Palwal by the Red Cross volunteers and district Coordinators so that the TB suspects living very close to the TB patients and others in surrounding areas should come forward for early diagnosis & treatment. Hand bills on the TB were distributed in the community. The volunteers held 1390 and 99 counselling sessions at DOT centres in Faridabad and Palwal respectively. 2313 and 942 home visits were made by Faridabad and Palwal district coordinators and volunteers.

The adherence report from the Haryana state branch shows that patient's adherence rate is 99%. Following is the adherence report:

<u>Gujarat:</u> The TB programme was extended in the year 2023-2024 under which a target of 500 TB patients was kept in the districts of Ahmedabad. During the year 2023-2024, 500 TB patients were enrolled in Gujarat district, out of which 435 were cured, 55 TB patients under treatment, 10 deaths as on 31st March 2023.

Proper attention was paid on awareness activities during the year. In this regard, 20 advocacy awareness a meetings and Mohalla Meetings were arranged by the Red Cross volunteers and district Coordinators so that the TB suspects living very close to the TB patients and others in surrounding areas should come forward for early diagnosis & treatment. Hand bills on TB were distributed in the community.

The adherence report from the Gujarat state branch shows that patient's adherence rate is 99%. Following the adherence reports:

<u>Punjab</u>: The Irish Red Cross supported the TB Project in the Punjab state branch for the year 2023-2024 under which a target of 600 TB patients was kept in the districts of Amritsar and Jalandhar. Volunteers conducted 1137 counselling sessions at the DOT centres and made 2948 home visits to TB patients. The project staff and volunteers also organised 160 group awareness meetings and 176 Mohalla meetings. The volunteers distributed 8740 TB hand bills.

INFORMATION & PUBLIC RELATIONS

The Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) plays a vital role in humanitarian efforts across the country, and its Information and Public Relations (PR) activities are crucial in building awareness and fostering engagement. Through strategic communication and outreach, the IRCS highlights its mission, initiatives, and impact, effectively informing the public and encouraging participation. Celebrating important days such as World Red Cross Day, National Blood Donation Day, and disaster preparedness week, the IRCS uses these occasions to enhance its branding, promote its services, and underscore its commitment to community welfare. These events not only raise awareness but also mobilize resources and volunteers, reinforcing the society's presence and mission in the public eye.

1. World Health Day 2023 was observed on April 7th, with the theme "Health for All." This theme emphasized the importance of ensuring that everyone, everywhere, has access to quality health services without facing financial hardship. The day aimed to raise awareness and mobilize efforts towards achieving universal health coverage and promoting global health equity.



World Malaria Day 2023, observed on April 25th, focused on the theme "Time to Deliver Zero Malaria: Invest, Innovate, Implement."
 This theme underscored the urgency of investing in malaria prevention and treatment, fostering innovation to develop new tools and strategies, and effectively implementing these solutions to achieve the goal of a malaria-free world.



3. World Red Cross Day 2023 was celebrated all over India on May 8th with the theme "Everything we do comes #fromtheheart." This theme emphasized the compassionate and heartfelt nature of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, highlighting the dedication and empathy that drive volunteers and staff to support communities in need.











4. World First Aid Day 2023, commemorated on September 9th, emphasized the theme "First Aid and Road Safety." The campaign aimed to raise awareness about the critical role of first aid in mitigating injuries and saving lives, especially in road traffic accidents. It underscored the importance of prompt and effective first aid responses to reduce the severity of injuries and improve outcomes in emergencies on the road.



5. National Voluntary Blood Donation Day 2023 was observed on 1st October with the theme "Donate Blood, Save Lives." The day highlighted the crucial role of voluntary blood donors in ensuring a stable and safe blood supply for medical emergencies and treatments across the country. It aimed to raise awareness about the importance of regular blood donations and encouraged more people to participate in this life-saving act.



6. Earth Day 2023 was celebrated on April 22nd with the theme "Invest in Our Planet." This theme emphasized the need for governments, businesses, and individuals to invest in sustainable practices and innovations to combat climate change and protect the environment for future generations. 8. World Thalassemia Day 2023, observed on May 8th, highlighted the theme of "Empowering individuals with thalassemia to live longer, healthier lives." It emphasized raising awareness about thalassemia, promoting access to quality healthcare, and supporting those affected to lead fulfilling lives.



International Nurses Day 2023 was observed on May 12th, celebrating the crucial contributions of nurses in healthcare. The theme for the year, "Nurses: A Voice to Lead - A Vision for Future Healthcare," highlighted nurses' pivotal role in shaping the future of healthcare through leadership and advocacy.



10. World Organ Donation Day 2023 was observed on August 13th. This day is observed every year to raise awareness about the importance of and help people understand organ donation as organ transplantation can help in saving and transforming the lives of people who have been fighting to survive. The theme for the year, "Step up to volunteer; need more organ donors to fill the lacunae" highlighted on an international appeal to the local populace to stress the significance of making an organ donation pledge, hence lowering the amount raised for the need for an organ.



11. International Women's Day 2023 was observed on 8th March 2024. The theme for International Women's Day 2023 was, 'DigitALL: Innovation and Technology for Gender Equality'. It recognizes and celebrates the women and girls who are championing the advancement of transformative technology and digital education.



12. World Cancer Day 2024, celebrated on February 4th, centered around the theme "Equity. Access. Now." This initiative highlighted the urgent need for equal access to cancer prevention, treatment, and care worldwide. The campaign aimed to raise awareness about disparities in cancer outcomes based on socioeconomic factors and geographical location.



13. World TB Day 2024, observed on March 24th, focused on the theme "Invest. End TB." It highlighted the importance of investing in TB prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and care to achieve the goal of ending tuberculosis globally. The day aimed to raise awareness about the impact of TB and mobilize support for efforts to eliminate this infectious disease.



14. National Youth Day 2024 commemorated the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda with the theme of "Empowering Youth for a Resilient Future." on 12th January. The day celebrated the ideals and contributions of Swami Vivekananda, emphasizing the role of youth in building a strong and resilient society through empowerment and active participation in nation-building activities.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

1. Wearable Device Project

ECIL develops a wearable health monitoring system (WHMS) device in association with AIIMS, Rishikesh. The system consists of an intelligent wearable instrument developed by ECIL for measuring vital parameters of Covid-19 patients like body Temperature, amount of blood oxygen (SpO2), Heartbeat Rate and Respiration Rate, and patient location. Novel application software remotely displays these parameters on a Mobile Phone, Laptop, or Desktop Computer for monitoring by the doctor from any location. The system will reduce the exposure of doctors or frontline healthcare personnel to serve Covid patients and can be easily installed on Hospital premises, Quarantine Centers. The device was tested successfully on different patients, including Covid-19 patients at AIIMS, Rishikesh, TATA Memorial & BARC-DAE hospitals in Mumbai.

Indian Red Cross Society, National Headquarters with the support of Canadian Red Cross handed over wearable device project to IRCS Kerala state branch in the month of December 2023. The details of assets handed over to the IRCS, Kerala state branch after completion of project include; Wearable Device from ECIL – 500 Nos, Clinical Monitoring software license, laptop for project monitoring - 05 nos, office furniture etc. Mr. Betman Bhandari, Canadian Red Cross Country Representative to India, Mr. Ajit Singh Rawat, DM dept. & Mr. Rajesh Chawla, Finance dept. from IRCS, NHQ visited Kerala State Branch in this connection.



2. Google project

Thousands of people living in the Brahmaputra and Ganga River basin in the states of Bihar and Assam face recurrent floods that impact lives and livelihoods every year. During 2019, 8.8 million people in Bihar and 50 million in Assam were affected by monsoon flooding. In order to reduce the impact of flood disaster in Assam and Bihar, the IRCS in collaboration with IFRC & Google Inc., conceived and implemented a project since June 2020 but officially agreement signed on 21 January 2021, entitled as "Improving Flood Early Warning Alert Systems: Empowering people to action in Assam & Bihar States" with a total budget of CHF 7,40,400, out of which CHF 305,991.69 transferred to IRCS to implement the project. The project was implemented in four districts (Lamkhimpur, Morigaon, Dhemaji and Majuli) covering 78 Panchayats in Assam and 3 districts (Sitamarhi, Muzzafarpur and Khagaria) covering 76 Panchayats in Bihar.

The goal of the project is to build flood resilience, protect human lives & livestock, assets and protect livelihoods of vulnerable communities through improved flood alert system and community engagement for preventive actions. This is a collaborative effort between Google, IRCS, International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Society (IFRC), the relevant ministries of the Government of India, the State Disaster Management Authority, the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD), Central Water Commission (CWC), UNICEF and administrations at the district and village levels.

The project aimed to build flood resilience in Assam and Bihar by educating key decision-makers (IRCS national and state leadership) and volunteers at the Panchayat level to disseminate this knowledge throughout communities. <u>Under the Google project more than 630 volunteers trained in Bihar and 613 in Assam.</u>

The project ensured constant vigilance by establishing 24/7 flood control rooms at state and district levels. These centres monitored and circulated flood alerts, especially crucial during monsoons. The control rooms were well-equipped with technology (LCDs, laptops, internet, video conferencing) for communication purposes, along with essential supplies (raincoats, torches, megaphones) and basic furniture for smooth operation.

During floods in 2022, alerts from government agencies (CWC) and ICIMOD were efficiently relayed through the project's network established under the Google Project. This network functioned by cascading messages from state headquarters to districts and then down to panchayats. Assam specifically benefitted from volunteer training in four districts, including panchayat-level training with mock flood drills, and control room management training for both volunteers and IRCS staff. To facilitate communication and review meetings, a video conferencing facility was also set up at the IRCS Assam headquarters.

To help households that have lost all their belongings due to flooding, the IRCS planned to preposition essential items such as Kitchen sets, hygiene kits and tarpaulins. Prepositioning these items not only helped these households maintain their dignity, but also helped to reduce the response time.

NHQ also provided the following relief items with a value of Rs. 3,44,01,301 as pre-positioned in Google Implementing State Branches, which are mentioned as under: -

3. Orientation classes for Nursing Students

During this orientation, students are introduced to the core values and mission of the IRCS, with a focus on how these principles align with their nursing education and future practice. IRCS encourages students to participate actively, ask questions, and take full advantage of this opportunity to connect with peers and mentors from across the country. SUMMARY OF REPORTS FROM THE BRANCHES

ANDHRA PRADESH

Andhra Pradesh State Branch (APSB) has completed 67 glorious years of dedicated volunteer service to the people of Andhra Pradesh, with the aim of protecting life, health, and human dignity irrespective of caste, creed, class, gender, or nativity. Andhra Pradesh State Branch has 26 District Branches and 143 Sub District Branches

Activities undertaken by the branch during FY 23-24 are as under:

A total of 2,23,786 from 1421 educational institutions were registered with the Junior Red Cross, and 1,74,361 students with Youth Red Cross during the year 2023-24. Details of JRC/YRC membership for the period of 2023-2024

B. Blood Services

- During 2023-24 the IRCS has conducted 1130 blood collection camps, collected 65,664 blood units, and issued 1,01,822.
- A total of 1003 Thalessmia patients were registered during this year, and 4804 units of blood were issued free of cost to them during the year 2023 24.

C. Relief activities and distribution

a) The Godavari River authorities issued a second flood warning for Bhadrachalam in Telangana and Dowleswaram in Andhra Pradesh on July 28, 2023. As many as 119 pregnant

women were evacuated. In Eluru district scores of affected tribal people were shifted to the nearby hilltop areas. The Government of Andhra Pradesh provided the victims with oil, red gram, and vegetables. A.P. State Branch sent relief materials to affected District Branches to the flood victims in Eluru, Konaseema, and Paderu Districts distributed to victims.

- b) Cyclone Michaung affected parts of Andhra Pradesh severely. Due to heavy rainfall, residential areas were flooded with flood water causing grave hardships for the people. AP Red Cross distributed 1950 hygiene Kits, 2200 Tarpaulin sheets, 600 kitchen sets, 50 Mosquito nets, and 52000 masks.
- c) The following relief was distributed to the IRCS district Branches for distribution to the needy and poor families during 2023-24.

D. Disaster Management Activities

- The IRCS, A.P. State Branch, has a dedicated professional field team with 26 professional staff spread over the 26 districts of A.P. The teams played a proactive role during the COVID pandemic & disasters.
- IRCS, District Branches have observed International Disaster Risk Reduction Day on October 13, 2023, and conducted awareness programs on DRR for AASHA workers, SERV, Panchyath Secretaries, Grama Volunteers, and Sachivalaya Secretaries at their respective areas every year.

E. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

- "Prana Mitra" Volunteer Training: IRCS, Kakinada District has taken up a unique initiative of Training Youth of the coastal Mandals of the District to serve in disasters under the "Prana Mithra" program. A total of 850 volunteers were trained with the support of ONGC.
- IRCS District Branches have organized Professional First Aid Training of 16 hours for the
 corporate and individuals. During the year, the district branches have conducted 87 senior
 professional first aid training programs covering 2156 students and employees trained in
 First Aid from various sectors and companies.

F. Health and Awareness Camps

- As a part of the health activities, IRCS-District Branches organized mega health camps in their respective districts. Dentists, Orthopedicians, Ophthalmic surgeons, and Gynecologists provided free services in different slums and interior unreachable areas.
- The IRCS, APSB & its IRCS District Branches have participated in the Jagananna Aarogya Suraksha Campaign in all respective IRCS Districts, and Red Cross Volunteers have been assisting the physically handicapped and senior citizens attending the Health Camps.
- 'LAKAMSANI VIREEN MANAS' Red Cross Eye Bank: Shri. S. Abdul Nazeer, Hon'ble Governor and President IRCS, AP State Branch in the presence of our State Chairman Dr A Sridhar Reddy, District Collector and President IRCS Kakinada inaugurated 'LAKAMSANI VIREEN MANAS' Red Cross Eye Bank and laid Foundation stone for Red Cross Childcare, Women

Welfare and skill Development Center at Kakinada on 31st January, 2024. Sri. Lakamsani Satyanarayana MD Sri Sairama Frozen Food has donated Rs.45.00 lakhs to the Eye Bank and M/s. Gemini Edibles & Fats India Ltd., came forward to donate Rs.43.33 lakhs for Childcare, WWSD Center construction

G. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

- During the academic year 2023-2024, all District Branches have enrolled in Government & Private Schools registered under JRC /YRC institutions and enrolled under J/YRC students. The JRC / YRC Units have conducted rallies, competitions, and awareness programs on special occasions in their respective districts during the academic year 2023-2024
- Crowd Management: Teams of Youth Red Cross Volunteers of IRCS, Srikakulam, NTR, and Bapatla districts volunteered in crowd management during popular festival days like Radha Sapthami, Samudra Snanalu and Navarathri.
- Tree plantation: All IRCS District Branches observed Red Cross events and special days as a
 part of the Junior and Youth Red Cross activities as per the guidelines of IRCS, NHQ, New
 Delhi. In this connection, 70,592 trees have been planted in 26 Districts by the Junior/Youth
 Red Cross volunteers under the Climate Action Initiative (CIA) during the year.
- Blood Grouping: The IRCS organized blood grouping activities for all JRC/YRC volunteers to know their blood group. A total of 21300 NSS volunteers were grouped and Blood grouping cards were issued.

H.Celebration of Important Days

The IRCS AP State Branch celebrated World Red Cross Day 2023 at Raj Bhavan on May 8, 2023, with Hon'ble Governor Shri S. Abdul Nazeer as Chief Guest, acknowledging their commendable services during the COVID-19 pandemic and urging expansion of services to remote tribal areas. District Collectors and philanthropists were honored with Red Cross medals for their contributions.

I. Other Activities

- Heat Waves: The IRCS APSB gave instructions to all District Branches to take up activities to
 mitigate the sufferings of the people on precautions to be taken. AP Red Cross had taken up
 many service activities, such as drinking water points on the roadside and at public places.
- All IRCS district branches provided wheelchair services and volunteer assistance to physically challenged, senior citizens, during the Spandana Programme in all District Collector's offices.
- AP Red Cross swung into action in the ghastly rail accident on the night of 2nd June in Balasore of Odisha state. The IRCS Visakhapatnam, Vizianagaram volunteers have participated in relief activities.

PUNJAB

A. Blood Services

To boost up the voluntary blood donation movement, the State Red Cross Branch has organized 68 voluntary blood donation camps in collaboration with local NGOs during the Year and collected 4801 blood units.

B. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

- a) An inter-state level Junior Red Cross camp was held in Moga to promote Red Cross objectives. The camp featured various inter-school activities, including group song competitions, poster making, solo song competitions, and a written quiz. Students learned about Red Cross activities such as health habits, cleanliness (Swachta Abhiyan), health awareness campaigns, blood grouping camps, blood donation demonstrations, and first aid training.
- b) IRCS Punjab held a state-level Junior Red Cross camp at Revalsar (Mandi). The camp aimed to promote Red Cross objectives and featured various inter-school activities such as group song competitions, poster making, solo song competitions, and a written quiz. Students learned about health habits, school cleanliness (Swachta Abhiyan), health awareness campaigns, blood grouping camps, blood donation demonstrations, and first aid training.
- c) IRCS Punjab state branch organized State Level Youth Red Cross Training cum Study Camp at SD Saravhitkari Vidya Mandir Talwara District Hoshiarpur. In this camp, total 172 Youth Red Cross Volunteers from Govt and Non Govt Colleges from the various Districts of Punjab participated actively. S.Shivdular Singh Dhil- Ion IAS(retd), Secretary Punjab State Red Cross was the Chief Guest. Apart from the other activities, First Aid Training and demonstration on CPR were also conducted.

C. <u>Disaster Management Activities</u>

Even as floods raged in the Ravi River on the Indo-Pakistan border, in Punjab, IRCS Gurdaspur district medical teams walked through flood waters right up to the people marooned in the last villages on the Indo-Pak border and organized a free medical check-up camp. In this camp, free medicines were distributed to the flood-affected families.

D. Medical and Awareness Camps

- Under the activity of the Tuberculosis Project, the volunteers delivered awareness lectures on Tuberculosis, how it spreads, and the precautions that need to be taken to avoid Tuberculosis.
 In light of this, the IRCS Punjab State Branch Staff and Volunteers jointly organized these campaigns and created awareness among individuals from April to June 2023.
- In the spirit of "Seva Pakhwada," a free 'Mega Multispecialty Health Checkup Camp' was held in Chandigarh, inaugurated by Punjab Governor Sh. Banwarilal Purohit. Organized by the Red Cross Society Punjab with contributions from various health organizations, the camp offered medical checkups, drug de-addiction awareness, and free medicines to the community.

- Red Cross Organises Medical Camp at Border Area Ferozpur (Punjab): Continuing its community service activities, the Red Cross Society, Punjab organized a medical camp where villagers were examined and free medicines were given.
- With a view to keeping students away from the ill effects of drugs, the IRCS Punjab drug
 de-addiction centers organized various de-addiction awareness campaigns at Schools this
 quarter. The campaigns are aimed to address the issue of drug abuse in the society so that
 the fight against the drugs could be strengthened at ground level
- On August 7, 2023, IRCS Gurdaspur organized an awareness seminar at the Employment
 Exchange office in District Complex Gurdaspur under the "Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyan"
 mission. The seminar highlighted the serious public health issues related to drug abuse
 and encouraged attendees to become brand ambassadors of the campaign by spreading
 awareness about drug addiction in their communities. The audience committed to actively
 disseminating the anti-addiction message and discussing drug abuse to dispel myths.
- The Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Branch, organized First Aid Medical and Blood Donation Camps in memory of Baba Zorawar Singh, Baba Fateh Singh, and Mata Gujri Ji.
 These camps, which included participation from the Drug De-addiction Centre Patiala team, were held over three days from December 21 to 27, coinciding with the Sacrificial Week.

E. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

The IRCS, Punjab State Branch, organized a First Aid & Home Nursing Lecturer refresher training camp at the Bharat Scout & Guide Camp Site in Raiwala, Uttarakhand. A total of 42 participants from different districts of Punjab attended the camp, where experts provided training on first aid in emergency situations and evacuation.

F. Relief activities and distribution

- Hon'ble Governor flagged off eight vehicles carrying relief material for disaster-hit people
 in Punjab. The relief material, which includes hygiene kits, tarpaulin, kitchen sets, blankets,
 etc was distributed to families affected by the natural calamity.
- On International First Aid Day, ration kits were distributed to TB patients at HMV College
 Jalandhar by the State Secretary, S. Shivdular Singh Dhillon IAS (retd). This initiative aims to
 support TB control and treatment programs by providing essential food items and supplies,
 helping patients maintain proper nutrition, and adhering to their treatment regimen, which
 is crucial for successful recovery.

Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Branch donated wheelchairs. This initiative is aimed at addressing the essential needs of elders and differently abled individuals. This donation of wheelchairs took place under the presence of Sh. Sanjay Tandon, Member Finance Commit- tee Punjab State Red Cross and other staff members of Punjab State Red Cross.

 Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab district Taran-Taran function organized a function in which 50 Umbrella Sewing machines were distributed to the needy. These sewing machines were distributed in the presence of the Deputy Commissioner cum President of the district Red Cross Branch and SDM of the Taran-Taran district.

G. Celebration of Important Days

WORLD RED CROSS DAY CELEBRATION:

The Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) Punjab State Branch celebrated World Red Cross Day at Punjab Raj Bhawan with Shri Banwarilal Purohit, Hon'ble Governor of Punjab, presiding. Ten motorized tricycles, ten sewing machines, and ten nutrition kits were distributed. The Hon'ble Governor, of Punjab flagged off a new hearse van. Additionally, a voluntary blood donation camp saw 180 students and Red Cross volunteers donating blood in collaboration with Chandigarh University, Mohali.

WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY:

The IRCS Punjab State Branch, in collaboration with the Strategic Institute for Public Health Education & Research, PGI Chandigarh, celebrated World No Tobacco Day on May 28, 2023, with a Walkathon cum Cyclothon, free medical check-ups, and awareness camps on tobacco's health risks. The event featured a First Aid Post, Dental Checkup Camp, Drug De-addiction briefings, and a Cancer screening camp in partnership with Homi Bhabha Cancer Hospital & Research Centre.

International Yoga Day:

The Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Branch celebrated International Yoga Day on June 21, 2023, with enthusiasm. Instructor Mr. Shivam led the session, starting with an introduction to yoga and its benefits for mental and physical health. The session included yoga prayers, warm-ups, and simple Asanas performed by staff members, with explanations of their importance.

Rakhi Celebration:

Nursing college students showed care and support by tying handmade rakhis on the wrists of
individuals admitted to the Drug De-addiction & Rehabilitation Centre at Saket Hospital, Patiala. The
rakhis were themed around "Nasha Mukt Bharat." Hon'ble Health Minister of Punjab, Dr. Balbir
Singh, along with the Deputy Commissioner and Civil Surgeon of Patiala, attended the event. Dr.
Singh addressed the inmates and praised the efforts of the team.

World Organ Donation Day

The IRCS Punjab Red Cross State branch celebrated World Organ Donation Day with School children. On this occasion, the expert spoke about the significance of organ donation. Also, the Secretary of Punjab State Red Cross S. Shiv Dular Singh Dhillon IAS (retd) enlightened the minds by highlighting the importance of organ donation, noting that it provides a lifeline to people facing terminal illnesses enabling them to regain health and rebuild their futures.

• The Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Branch, celebrated '<u>Dheeyan Di Lori'</u> (<u>Girl Child Lohri</u>) to promote the message of saving the girl child and providing equal opportunities for girls. Newborn daughters and their parents participated, and Secretary S. Shivdular Singh Dhillon IAS (retd.) distributed sweets to congratulate the parents. Staff members from both the Punjab and Haryana State Branches participated enthusiastically. The celebration concluded with "Lohri Poojan."

- The IRCS, Punjab State Branch, celebrated <u>International Women's Day</u> at their premises, attended by 130 women and special guests. Mrs. Prajakta Avhad, Chairperson of the Child Welfare Council Punjab, was the chief guest. Dr. Smita Sharma from Punjab University gave a keynote address on the challenges faced by women and the need for collective action. The event featured cultural performances by students. The celebration concluded with the distribution of hygiene kits to all attendees.
- On December 5, the IRCS Society, Punjab State Branch celebrated International Volunteer Day with enthusiasm. The event began with a tribute to Bhai Ghanayia Ji by the dignitaries. Dr. Vandita Pahwa from Tata Memorial Centre Homi Bhabha Cancer Hospital, New Chandigarh, also gave a presentation on volunteers and togetherness, followed by Mr. Pritam, Sr. Volunteer, who shared his experiences.

H. SPECIAL VISITS AND MEETINGS

- An inspection of Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Drug De-addiction Centre, Saket Hospital Patiala was held and grant in aid was done By DSSO Sh.Varinder Singh Bains, DMC Dr.Jaswinder Singh, Dr.Harjot (psychiatry department). They all were very satisfied by the management and services going on in the hospital.
- Sh. Harish Dayama IPS, Senior Superintendent of Police paid a surprise visit to Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Drug De-addiction Centre, Gurdaspur interacted with all the 30 youngsters getting treatment against addiction and motivated with this impressive counseling to shun addiction and join the mainstream so as to make Drug free Punjab.

I.Other Activities

- IRCS Punjab under the CSR initiative of Vardhman AE has set up a new State Of Art "Red Cross Vocational Training Centre for Women. A total of three courses will be run under this center with an updated curriculum which includes computer training, steno & typing, beauty & wellness. Along with this, it will also include computer accounting, sessions on IT, and GST return filling for commerce students.
- Wings: An Initiative by Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State IRCS, Punjab District Hoshiarpur launched a pioneering initiative in Punjab called the "Wings" Project for Special Children. This project aims to help special children earn a livelihood by opening four tuck shops in educational institutes in Hoshiarpur. Eight special children were trained for nearly three months to learn hospitality and service skills to run these canteens. These children have successfully started running the tuck shops.
- On October 7, 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Drug De-addiction Centre
 Patiala organized an awareness activity. Students from the Ashoka Group of Nursing Institute,
 Patiala, created handmade paintings to raise awareness against drug use. Each student
 demonstrated their painting to the inmates to motivate them to give up these harmful
 substances. The event was attended by the entire staff and admitted inmates.

A Blood Donation Camp was held in the remote backward area of Punjab at the rural area Government College, Pojewal, by the Indian Red Cross Society volunteer group of the College in collaboration with other NGOs. S.Shivdular Singh Dhillon IAS (Retd), Secretary of Indian Red Cross Society, Punjab State Branch inaugurated the Camp. He laid special emphasis on encouraging and promoting volunteering for the Blood Donation movement in this remote area.

Manipur

Since March 1, 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur State Branch, has served the community with dedication and humanitarian principles. During the COVID-19 pandemic, they raised awareness and distributed protective items. Amid the 2023 conflict, they provided relief, conducted First Aid training, and promoted Social Behavioral Change in camps, thanks to their committed volunteers.

A. **Blood Services**

During the conflict, the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur State Branch continued blood donation drives at JNIMS and RIMS hospitals. They also organized outdoor programs at DM College of Arts and T.S. Paul Manipur Women's College in collaboration with RIMS, aiming to engage the community and raise awareness despite the challenging circumstances.

B. Relief activities and distribution

- During a visit to a widow whose house was burnt down by fire in Naojai village, Maram, the Indian Red Cross Society provided 2 woolen blankets, 2 mosquito nets, 2 hygiene kits, and a tent for temporary stay
- A team visited Ngamun and Lhangcham villages to assist Myanmar nationals fleeing political unrest, distributing relief items to approximately 200 individuals.
- Visits were made by the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur to Churachandpur on April 19, 2023, and to Senjam Khunou/Senjam Chaprou on April 20, 2023. During these visits, relief items including tarpaulins, mosquito nets, and hygiene kits were distributed.
- 600 hygiene kits distributed to Bishnupur, Imphal East, Imphal West, Kakching, Kangpokpi, and Thoubal districts, sourced from UNICEF, Assam and NE states
- On May 3, 2023, during a communal dispute, relief efforts were conducted by the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur State Branch. Relief materials were provided to internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Kwakta, Bishnupur area. Relief items were distributed in relief camps located at Moirang Sandhong, Shribon Mandap, Chingu Thangjing Guest House, and Khuyol Keithel.

- From May 6th to 11th 2024, the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur State Branch, conducted extensive relief operations and health camps. They set up tents at 2nd MR campus, 86th and 145th CRPF camps, distributing relief supplies across Bishnupur, Imphal East, Imphal West, Kakching, and Thoubal districts.
- In May 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur State Branch initiated ambulance services, transporting over 100 individuals with gunshot wounds and assisting 75 agitating women and students to receive hospital admission during conflict incidents, protests, and demonstrations.
- On September 1, 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur State Branch received relief materials from IRCS National Headquarters and distributed them to approximately 5000 families in relief camps across various districts, facilitated by District Branches and Commissioners. Donors were acknowledged for their generous support.

C. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

- A team of nine members conducted dissemination cum first aid training at various locations in the Jiribam district. The training sessions were held in Lamkhai Bazar, Kadampokpi, JIMPAL Hall, Lalpani, and Kalinagar. The topics covered included first aid techniques, disaster preparedness, and health education.
- The IRCS, Manipur conducted first aid training for villagers, security personnel, and other
 organizations during conflict situations. Additionally, they organized a 3-day first aid
 certificate training in the Thoubal and Kakching District Branches. First aid training programs
 are ongoing for various organizations.

D. SPECIAL VISITS AND MEETINGS

- Office bearers of theRCS, Manipur State Branch, met with Miss Anusuiya Uikey, Honourable Governor and President of IRCS Manipur State Branch, to apprise her of the present status of the State Branch.
- On July 17, 2023, officials from the IRCS, Manipur State Branch, met with the President of India and Union Health Minister to discuss the situation in Manipur. They requested relief materials for internally displaced persons (IDPs), alongside the Hon'ble Governor of Manipur, highlighting the urgent needs and ongoing humanitarian efforts in the region.

E. Celebration of Important Days

 On April 7, 2023, the IRCS, Manipur State Branch, observed World Health Day at their office premises. Dr. Y. Radheshyam Singh, Dr. Y. Mohen Singh, and Dr. RK. Nimai Singh attended as chief guest, president, and guest of honor, respectively. The theme for the observance was "Health for All," with a special focus on youth. On April 25, 2023, World Malaria Day was observed with a significant event at T.S. Paul Manipur Women's College, Mongshangei, where the Youth Red Cross (YRC) unit was inaugurated. Dr. Brogen Singh Akoijam, serving as the resource person, highlighted key aspects of malaria prevention and treatment during the ceremony.

F. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

A one-day sensitization program on Disaster Management was held at SAIRAM, Patsoi, attended by a 7-member youth team from the I, Manipur State Branch (IRCS, MSB). The program featured Mr. Kanai Senju, an instructor from Tokyo Disaster Prevention, Japan, as the resource person, sharing valuable insights and practices in disaster preparedness and management.

G.Medical and Awareness Camps

- From May 6-11, 2024, the IRCS, Manipur State Branch, conducted health camps at NB College, Imphal East, and Sekmai Relief Camp, in collaboration with the IMA and other partners, provided essential medical services to those affected.
- The IRCS, Manipur State Branch, conducted 13 programs focused on Psychological Support, collaborating with psychiatrists and clinical psychologists. These programs included awareness sessions, children's interaction and entertainment programs, and treatment with medication. Free medications were provided to internally displaced persons (IDPs) as part of these initiatives.

H. Other Activities

- With assistance from the IRCS, Assam State Branch, the IRCS, Manipur State Branch acquired 2000 kitchen sets and 1500 hygiene kits. These supplies were transported via two trucks on the Imphal-Dimapur road, facilitated by the Senapati District Branch despite road closures, ensuring essential items reached Imphal.
- The IRCS, Manipur State Branch, collaborated with UNICEF and Northeastern states for Social
 and Behavioral Change (SBC) initiatives, focusing on WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene)
 activities. Initially engaging in 50 relief camps, these efforts later extended to additional
 districts. Activities included constructing temporary toilets, installing water filter units, and
 distributing hygiene and dignity kits to promote better health and sanitation practices among
 affected communities.

TRIPURA

The Tripura State Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society was established in Agartala on September 15, 1959. It currently operates with 7 District Branches across the state, comprising 1116 active Red Cross Volunteers and 1089 Members (including 21 Patrons). The West Tripura District Branch has merged with the State Branch, located in Agartala, which serves as the district headquarters as well. The State Managing Committee (SMC), formed on April 29, 2021, has implemented various new and innovative outreach activities to support people in distress, including during the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic that affected the state two years ago.

B. Blood Services

Four voluntary blood donation camps were organized by the Indian Red Cross Society, Tripura State Branch. These camps were held at Tripura University, the Blind Association of Tripura, and the battalion headquarters of the 124th and 128th CRPF Units.

C. Relief activities and distribution

- 1) A wide range of outreach activities were conducted to support people in distress, including distribution of face masks, sanitizers, hygiene kits, hand washing soaps, sarees, dhotis, plastic buckets, and blankets across the state.
- 2)Distributed a large number of hygiene kits to girl students in various schools across Khowai, Unakoti, Dhalai, and West Tripura Districts.

D. <u>Disaster Management Activities</u>

- Organized under the Disaster Management initiatives of the District Magistrate and Collector of West Tripura District, the Indian Red Cross Society, Tripura State Branch conducted a School Safety program.
- The North, Sepahijala (Sonamura), and Gomati District Committees of the Indian Red Cross Society, Tripura State Branch, organized mock drills in various locations within their respective districts to prepare for disaster scenarios.
- Participated in two seminars organized by the Principal Secretary (Revenue) and the District Magistrate (DM) & Collector of West Tripura on disaster preparedness and Kaal Baishkhi storm. The role of Red Cross volunteers was highlighted, and important data was shared during these events.
- In association with the District Administrations all the Branches organized mock drill for rescue to safety & security of the people facing disaster in the likely event of earth earthquake attack including training on first aids.

E.Medical and Awareness Camps

 A wide range of outreach activities were conducted to support people in distress, including distribution of face masks, sanitizers, hygiene kits, hand washing soaps, sarees, dhotis, plastic buckets, and blankets across the state.

 Organized a health and sanitary awareness program for girl students at Shankaracharya School and Shishu Bihar School, focusing on puberty education to enhance their understanding and knowledge.

F. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

1)Four First Aid training programs were conducted by the Tripura State Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society. These included two programs for players and coaches of the Tripura Cricket Association, one for employees of the Airport Authority of India at Agartala Airport, and another for GAIL employees at their office premises.

2)First Aid and Red Cross activities training courses were conducted for students at the BRAM Nursing School in Agartala by the Tripura State Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society.

3)The North Tripura District Committee organized First Aid training for employees of the Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL) stationed at the Dharmanagar terminal.

4)IRCS Tripura state branch conducted First Aid training for GNM students at the Government Nursing College in Agartala.

5)IRCS Tripura state branch conducted First Aid training for 4th semester M.Sc. students at BRAM Medical College & Teaching Hospital in Agartala.

G.Celebration of Important Days

Celebrated both the International Day of Yoga and the World Red Cross Day at the Municipal playground in Bordowali, Agartala and at the Red Cross Bhavan in Agartala, respectively. These events saw significant participation from the community.

H.SPECIAL VISITS AND MEETINGS

His Excellency the Governor of Tripura, also serving as the President of the Society, graciously visited the Red Cross facility on November 22, 2023. During his visit, he inspected the facility and engaged in detailed discussions with the State Managing Committee (SMC) members present regarding the Society's operations.

I.Other Activities

Organized by the Indian Red Cross Society, Tripura State Branch, the Walkathon program aimed to promote good health among Tripura's youth. This initiative was sponsored by ONGC, Tripura Asset.

Arunachal Pradesh

A. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

A team of Junior Red Cross members and interns from Rajiv Gandhi University organized voluntary donations for Sikkim flash flood victims from October 12 to October 14, 2023.

B. Disaster Management Activities

A massive fire broke out in Karsingsa, Arunachal Pradesh on January 23, 2023, caused by a short-circuit, which affected 5 households and displaced 19 individuals. The Indian Red Cross Society, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch, responded swiftly the following day, distributing relief items to assist the fire victims.

On January 26, 2023, a fire incident in Larmuk Potom Village, West Siang District, Arunachal Pradesh, left 22 family members homeless. The Indian Red Cross Society, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch, swiftly distributed relief items to support the affected families.

Two houses were destroyed in a fire outbreak at Jipu village, Lower Siang District, on February 4, 2023, leaving 10 family members homeless. The IRCS, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch, responded promptly by distributing relief items to support the affected families in Jipu Village.

C. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

The Indian Red Cross Society conducted First Aid Training of Trainers in Faridabad, Haryana, Delhi-NCR.

D. Relief activities and distribution

- Distribution of hygiene kits to orphaned and Puroik students of G-Sector School, Naharlagun was conducted by the Indian Red Cross Society, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch.
- On October 13, 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch distributed blankets and hygiene kits to 74 orphaned and 25 Puroik students of G-Sector School, Naharlagun.
- In February 2024, the Indian Red Cross Society, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch, conducted a
 distribution of hygiene kits to students at Government Upper Primary School in ESS Sector, Itanagar,
 Gyan Mission Orphanage in Jollang, and Donyi Polo Hearing and Impaired Mission School in Itanagar.

G. Other Activities

In the past, through its dedicated services in the Tibetan Refugee camps at Missamari in the year 1959, Language disturbances in the Goreswar Relief camps in the year 1961-62, the Indo- China war of 1962, deadly epidemic of 1965, East Pakistan refugee camps at Garo Hills during the East Pakistan civil War 1966 and Bangladesh Liberation war 1971, the Society earned international reputation.

B. Blood Services

IRCS, ASB has been continuing the blood services through the following ways;

- a. Collect Blood by organizing Voluntary Blood donation camps in collaboration with Govt. Blood Banks & Red Cross Blood Bank.
- b. Awareness about blood donation.

C. Relief activities and distribution

IRCS, Assam State Branch is running an Orphanage at Lankeswar, Jalukbari, Guwahati with 20 boys and the children belong to families either affected by flood and ethnic violence or as per guidelines of the Social Welfare Department and State Child Protection Society. The children are studying at the local schools and are monitored by a competent pool of staff. The Orphanage provides homely shelters, food, education, caretaking, health & security to orphana at Red Cross Orphanage.

D. <u>Disaster Management Activities:</u>

IRCS, ASB is always ready to assist the public affected by any hazard time to time. Following many humanitarian actions are carried out under this branch for the benefit of the people.

- a. Trainings for community volunteers/ Red Cross Members etc.
- b. Awareness about Disaster preparedness.
- c. Early warning for flood & weather forecast.
- d. Rescue & sheltering. e. Humanitarian Aid distribution.
- f. Psychosocial support to victims.
- g. Rehabilitation & livelihood support.
- h. Raise platforms for flood prone areas.

E. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

IRCS, Assam State Branch conducted more than 37 nos. of commercial First Aid training in various organizations like Oil India Limited, ONGC, Indian Oil Corporation, Britannia Ltd., etc. In the year 2023

IRCS, ASB has been implementing its first aid services for the last several years in the following categories

a. First Aid Training for employees of hazardous sectors, and corporate companies.

b. First Aid Training for students, community volunteers, members/ employees of other organizations/ institutions, etc.

The Red Cross Hospital is a flagship program of the Indian Red Cross Society and presently it is running 3 Hospitals in Guwahati, Silchar & Karimganj. It has been providing health care to the community with a particular focus on Maternity and Child Health Care, as well as providing OPD, immunization, and rural health services. Apart from the Red Cross Nursing Training Centres are claimed to be North East India's oldest Nurses' Training Institute. Presently there are nursing institutes in the states in Guwahati & Silchar. The following services are available under this service.

- a. Health services through Red Cross Hospitals.
- b. Free Health Checkups, and medicine distribution camps.
- c. Ambulatory services. d. Health Awareness programs. e. ANM Trainings.

F. SPECIAL VISITS AND MEETINGS

- A.K. Absar Hazarika, Chairman & Deba Prasad Sarma, Hony. General Secretary, Indian Red Cross Society, Assam State Branch visited IRCS, NHQ and conducted a meeting with the Secretary General, IRCS National Headquarters (NHQ) regarding various branch development activities on 9 th February 2023.
- A moment of the delegation of the Indian Red Cross Society Assam State Branch met with the Honorable Governor and the President of the State Branch on 30th March 2023 and 21st December, 2023 and briefed him about the various developmental activities in the State.
- The Indian Red Cross Society, Assam State Branch in collaboration with the Rashtriya Madhyamik Siksha Abhijan to showcase an online session on First Aid in Emergencies at the Assam Tele Education Centre, Govt. of Assam. The event was a Virtual Studio-Based Event for Government School Children in Assam. On October 7, 2023, our team held an hour-long LIVE and Interactive Academic session on First Aid Training in Emergencies, with 2064 schools participating and 1,85,875 kids (Grades 6-10) benefiting.
- The Annual General Meeting of the Indian Red Cross Society (NHQ) at the Bhavan, New Delhi on 17th July 2023 and presided over by the Honorable President of India. Hon'ble Governor of Assam & the President, IRCS ASB along with the Vice- Chairman and General Secretary attended the meeting.

G.Celebration of Important Days

- IRCS Guwahati District Branch has celebrated World Health Day- 2023 at the Red Cross Hospital Campus
- IRCS Margherita Sub District Branch has observed the International Yoga Day- 2023 and organized a Yoga camp in Margherita where many people and youth Red Cross volunteers have participated.
- The IRCS Margherita Sub-District Branch celebrated Human Rights Day 2023 in Margherita by organizing a seminar on "Human Rights and its Relevance" and "Dignity, Freedom, and Justice," where many dignitaries delivered speeches on these topics.
- Indian Red Cross Society, Dibrugarh District Branch celebrated World Red Cross Day in 2023.

H. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

IRCS, ASB has been implementing its JRC & YRC program last several years in the following ways

- a. Junior Red Cross Programs in schools & Youth Red Cross Programs in colleges through its J/YRC Units to promote humanitarian values in societies through students.
- b. To promote behavioral change in society through students and make the J/YRC volunteers an Agent of Behavioral Change.
- c. Enhance the National & International friendship among students and encourage volunteerism among them.

• I.Medical and Awareness Camps

IRCS Dima Hasao District Branch has conducted Health awareness programs in various places in the district to educate people on how to maintain good health.

- The IRCS Morigaon District branch has organized Free medical health checkup camps with a supply of medicines at various places in the district in collaboration with different local bodies in their respective areas during the year.
- The IRCS Karbi Anglong District Branch has conducted several Free Health Camps and provided free medicines to the beneficiaries at different places in the district during the year. The branch has distributed Mosquito nets to the needy people at the health camps.

J.Other Activities

The IRCS Assam State Branch, in collaboration with the IRCS Karbi Anglong District Branch, is planning a major agricultural project in Bi-Sarpo village, Karbi Anglong district. They conducted a preliminary assessment and survey in the proposed area. The project includes establishing a school and a basic health center to serve seven villages. Additionally, an agricultural initiative will be launched on the proposed land. All preliminary formalities with the relevant authorities have been completed.

Since 2021, the Indian Red Cross Society Assam State Branch has been enhancing the Flood Early Warning Alert System in four highly flood-prone districts with support from IRCS National Headquarters, IFRC, and Google. They have now initiated a collaboration with Monday.com to incorporate digital emergency response and preparedness tools into the system.

Maharashtra

Since March 1, 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society, Manipur State Branch, has served the community with dedication and humanitarian principles. During the COVID-19 pandemic, they raised awareness and distributed protective items. Amid the 2023 conflict, they provided relief, conducted First Aid training, and promoted Social Behavioral Change in camps, thanks to their committed volunteers.

A. Blood Services

25th April: The Ch. Sambhaji Nagar District Branch organized a Blood Donation Camp in memory of the Late Ku. Sarika Kabara, in collaboration with Lions Blood Bank. The event was successful, collecting a total of 25 units of blood.

B. Relief activities and distribution

- 20 nos of Oxygen Concentrators were sent to the Jalgaon District Branch, further Maharashtra State Branch facilitated 12383 pulse oximeters to Solapur, Jalgaon, Barshi Sub District, Arvi and Wardha, and 200 nos of Resuscitation bags to Jalgaon District Branch from Vikhroli warehouse
- India Ratings & Research Pvt. Ltd, Mumbai, as part of their CSR partnership with the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) Maharashtra State Branch, disbursed a total of Rs.
 1.17 crore for various initiatives. This funding was allocated towards purchasing surgical equipment, including a surgical loop with LED light and various endoscopes, for Bel-Air Hospital in Wai. Additionally, the funds were used to buy equipment for a new Blood Storage Centre at the Indian Red Cross Society Jalgaon District Branch and to acquire a blood bag centrifuge and storage freezer for the Indian Red Cross Society's Gopabai Damani Blood Centre in Solapur.
- As part of their CSR partnership with the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) Maharashtra State Branch, Fitch Group of Company, Mumbai, disbursed Rs. 30 lakh. This funding was allocated towards purchasing OPD and operation theatre equipment for Bel-Air Hospital in Wai, acquiring a blood storage freezer (BR-300) for the Indian Red Cross Society's Gopabai Damani Blood Centre in Solapur, and purchasing a school bus for mentally disabled special children at the Indian Red Cross Society in Kolhapur.
- Addressing menstrual hygiene challenges, IRCS-Mumbai distributed 4,147 Sanitary Napkin Hampers to menstruating school and college-going women between 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024. Each hamper included 12 packets of sanitary napkins, with each packet containing 10 sanitary napkins and 4 panty liners.

C. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

Since April 2023 till March 2024, the branch have conducted a total of 27 First Aid training sessions, training 550 participants in total. These programs are designed to enhance the capacity of individuals, particularly staff members, to save lives during emergencies. The training is provided to NGOs, Housing Society Associations, companies, institutions, and groups of individuals who wish to be trained.

- The Ch. Sambhaji Nagar District Branch organized a First Aid and CPR Workshop to enhance emergency response skills.
- IRCS Mumbai Conducted 16 First Aid and CPR training sessions, benefiting 345 participants during the period from 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024. This initiative aims to equip individuals with essential life-saving skills and enhance workplace safety and team morale.

D. <u>Disaster Management Activities:</u>

The Maharashtra State Red Cross has committed to providing Disaster Management Equipment on a returnable basis to vulnerable wards of the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai (MCGM) from June to October each year. The equipment includes 7 life buoys, 11 life jackets, 3 electronic lights, 7 whistles, 3 ropes, 5 pairs of dotted gloves, and 1 tin trunk, totaling 37 items.

E. Celebration of Important Days

- 8th May: The Ch. Sambhaji Nagar District Branch celebrated World Red Cross Day
 with various events. These included a program at AYME Hall, workshops on heart
 attack prevention and first aid techniques, observance of International Red Cross Day
 at Bal Sudhar Gruh, and celebrations at Government Medical College.
- On 8th May 2023, the IRCS Nashik district branch broadcasted a feature on Red Cross by Dr. Sunil Aundhkar on Sindhudurg Radio Station for World Red Cross Day served to amplify their message of humanitarian service. Felicitating veterans like Brigadier A.
 M. Varty and Major P. M. Bhagat honored their longstanding contributions.
- They conducted a tree plantation drive in honor of World Environment Day, promoting environmental conservation.
- On June 30, 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society Branch Solapur, Family Planning Association, and Ashwini Sahakari Hospital & Research Center jointly honored six distinguished doctors on "Doctors Day" at Ashwini Sahakari Hospital & Research Center, Solapur.
- World Health Day, April 7, 2023, saw a health camp organized at Rasta Peth and M.G. Road by IRCS Pune, offering general check-ups, hemoglobin tests, sugar screenings, ECG, chest X-rays, bone density tests, and dental and eye check-ups for a total of 37 patients.
- On World Women's Day, March 8, 2023, IRCS Pune organized a comprehensive medical camp at Rasta Peth, providing free health services including screenings for sugar levels, blood pressure, bone density, breast examinations, mammography, ECG, dental, and ophthalmic check-ups, benefiting 42 patients.

- To mark World Thalassemia Day on May 7, 2023, IRCS Pune hosted a drawing and painting competition for Thalassemia children, organized by Art India Foundation. Participants received gifts and snacks, promoting awareness and support for Thalassemia awareness.
- On December 1, 2023, for World AIDS Day, the Indian Red Cross Society's Solapur branch participated in a rally organized by the DAPCU office (MSACS) Solapur, using their Ambulance Van to raise awareness about AIDS in the society.

F. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

- Junior Red Cross organized visits and programs at schools and colleges like St. Thomas
 Public School and IMCC College, Pune.
- Junior Red Cross conducted awareness programs at City Pride School, Keystone School of Engineering, and others.
- Junior Red Cross set up a water distribution center and First Aid booth at LIC building.
- Activities conducted by schools & colleges under Junior Red Cross, with the theme "Let Communities Lead."
- Junior Red Cross volunteers underwent orientations and supported PMC's pulse polio immunization campaign at various centers.

G.Medical and Awareness Camps

- **5th August**: In collaboration with Lions Club Midtown, the Ch. Sambhaji Nagar District Branch conducted a blood grouping and diabetic check-up camp at Kachner, covering approximately 350 students. This camp aimed to promote health awareness and early detection of diabetes among students.
- Nashik District Red Cross conducted an awareness lecture on 9th April 2023 a Viral Fever for Social Work Students of MVP College of Social Work underscored their proactive approach in educating youth about prevalent health issues.
- On April 15, 2023, a health check-up camp was organized at Red Cross Bhavan, Thane Branch in collaboration with Mali Samaj Sanstha Thane. The camp featured services rendered by Dr. Shirish Kulkarni (Skin Specialist), Dr. Pradeep Hule (Ortho), and Dr. Sanjay Kadam (M.O.), with a total of 30 patients examined.
- On August 29, 2023, Ulhasnagar Sub-District Branch conducted a health check-up camp featuring Bone Mineral Density (BMD), Hemoglobin, Height & Weight checks at our center through Krishna Diagnostics, Dombivli. Approximately 64 patients benefitted from the camp.

H. Other Activities

- The Canadian Red Cross has offered to develop the Vikhroli warehouse. A preliminary
 site meeting and informal discussions on the construction model were held with
 CRC/NHQ representatives. The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) or Term Sheet
 between the Canadian Red Cross and NHQ is now awaited. The Chairman will discuss
 the project's development status during his next visit to IRCS, NHQ New Delhi.
- The Indian Red Cross Society's School for the Deaf in Pune focuses on quality education and holistic development, providing therapeutic interventions and academic activities aimed at fostering independence and responsibility among students. Monthly evaluations ensure ongoing improvement in school performance and teaching quality.

Meghalaya

A. Relief activities and distribution

- Relief materials were distributed to Mr. Joitsing Khongjee, a resident of Nongkhleng Village, Pynursla Block, by the Indian Red Cross Society, Meghalaya State Branch, Shillong. The distribution was conducted by the General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, and Field Assistant.
- On 4th July 2023, relief materials were distributed to two families whose houses and a shop were gutted by fire in Mairang.
- On December 21st, 2023, the Vice Chairman visited Lumplaring and distributed blankets donated by the IRCS Meghalaya to the poor.
- In February 2024, the General Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, and other
 officials of the Meghalaya State Branch conducted a series of visits across various
 locations in West and East Jaintia Hills, Mawsynjri Kharang, Jaiaw, Mylliem,
 Nongshiliang, Mawlai, Saw Lad, South West Khasi Hills, and Pynursla to distribute
 humanitarian aid to those in need.

B. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

 From April to July 2023, First Aid and Search and Rescue training sessions were conducted for Elite Task Security & Service Agency at their training center in Laitkroh, Mawjrong. These sessions, led by Ms. MGR Shabong, Mr. P. Deb, and Miss I. Swer from the IRCS State Branch, saw participation from a total of 33 participants in April, 33 participants in June, and 73 participants in July.

- On 28th-29th September 2023, IRCS conducted First Aid and Search and Rescue training for Tornado Security Agency at their training center in Mawiong. The training concluded with a mock drill.
- From June 6th to 14th, 2023, the Meghalaya Administrative Training Institute organized First Aid and Search and Rescue training sessions in collaboration with DDMA EKH, Government of Meghalaya. These included a two-day session for Martin Luther Christian University on June 6th-7th, a one-day session for government officials on June 12th, and another two-day session for A&G on June 13th-14th. The training was conducted by the IRCS Meghalaya State Branch to enhance emergency response capabilities.
- Throughout July and August 2023, the District Disaster Management Authority, in partnership
 with the Meghalaya Administrative Training Institute, conducted multiple training sessions on
 First Aid and Search and Rescue across various locations including Nongkwar Secondary
 School, Pynthorumkhrah Golf Links Higher Secondary School, etc. These trainings, facilitated
 by the IRCS Meghalaya State Branch, concluded with mock drills to enhance emergency
 response preparedness.
- In early 2024, IRCS Meghalaya conducted First Aid and Search and Rescue training: 30th Jan for Power Grid Corp. with 25 participants, 1st-2nd Feb for Elite Task Security at Laitkroh with 30 participants; earlier from 22nd-25th Jan, Tornado Security in Mawiong trained 66 participants.
- In March 2024, the IRCS Meghalaya State Branch conducted several First Aid and Search and Rescue training courses, including sessions for Tornado Security Agency and Elite Task Security & Service Agency, with participant numbers ranging from 31 to 35. All trainings were led by Ms. MGR Shabong, Mr. P. Deb, and Miss I. Swer.

C.SPECIAL VISITS AND MEETINGS

- On 25th April 2023, a J/YRC Sub-Committee meeting was held at the State Headquarters to discuss the tentative program for 2023-2024 and other agenda items. The meeting was chaired by Smti. I. Sohtun, Deputy Director of DSEL, Education Department. A total of 22 members were present.
- On 22nd May 2023, a Programme Officer and Counsellor meeting was held at the State
 Headquarters to discuss the tentative program for 2023-2024 and other agendas. The
 meeting was chaired by the General Secretary, with a total of 28 members present.
- On 17th July 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society's Annual General Meeting was held at Rashtrapati Bhavan, presided over by Smt. Droupadi Murmu, Hon'ble President of India and IRCS President. The meeting, chaired by Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, Union Health Minister, took place at Rashtrapati Bhawan Cultural Centre, with Mr. R.O. Wallang IFS (Retd), Chairman, and Mr. Andrew N. Sawian, General Secretary of IRCS Meghalaya State Branch, in attendance alongside several Governors and Lieutenant Governors.

 From 11th to 15th August 2023, IRCS Meghalaya State Branch participated in the Independence Day celebrations. Mr. P. Deb, Organizer, along with six members from YRCS of Synod College, assisted the medical team during the event. On the same day, the team also visited the Raj Bhawan.

D.Celebration of Important Days

- On 8th May 2023, World Red Cross Day was celebrated at Raj Bhavan in the presence of the Hon'ble Governor of Meghalaya and President of the Indian Red Cross Society, Meghalaya State Branch, Shri Phagu Chauhan. The program included cultural presentations by various JRCS units and the release of the World Red Cross flag by the Governor. The event was attended by life members, students, counselors, program officers, state government officers, and dignitaries. The celebration concluded with light refreshments.
- On 8th March 2024, the Youth Red Cross Unit of St. Mary's College observed International Women's Day, aiming to raise awareness about gender equality and women's rights while acknowledging and appreciating the contributions of women in various fields.

E. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

 On 8th June 2023, the JRC Unit of Gorkha Pathshala Higher Secondary School organized a blood donation camp at their auditorium in collaboration with the IRCS Meghalaya State Branch, State Blood Transfusion Council, and National Health Mission. A total of 14 units of blood were collected.

From 25th to 29th September 2023, JRC/YRC units of various institutions were requested by the state headquarters to conduct a cleaning drive competition as part of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. Prizes for the competition were distributed during the annual day celebration, as per the JRC units' participation.

- On November 9th, 2023, the Youth Red Cross Unit and the NSS Unit organized an awareness program and blood donation camp in collaboration with Pasteur Institute and Red Cross Society, Shillong, Meghalaya. The program commenced with an awareness talk delivered by Dr. B. Passah, a specialist in transfusion medicine, in the presence of 200 participants. In total, approximately 68 donors participated in the camp.
- On 29th March 2024, the NSS Unit of St. Mary's College, in collaboration with the Youth Red Cross Unit, organized an outreach program with a visit to Jyntah RCUP (SSA) School.

F.Medical and Awareness Camps

 On 11th July 2023, a free medical health camp was conducted along with the distribution of relief materials at Low-u-Sib for the displaced persons of Manipur by the IRCS Meghalaya.

G.Other Activities

- On October 12th, 2023, the Indian Red Cross Society, Meghalaya State Branch
 participated in the state-level Megha Mock Exercise conducted by MSDMA. This
 exercise was observed by members of the National Disaster Management Authority,
 district-level officials, and other agencies. Polo and adjoining areas, including Shillong
 Secondary School and Forest Colony, were selected as identified locations for the
 mock exercise.
- On 23rd March 2024, the Indian Red Cross Society, Meghalaya State Branch, attended the one-year anniversary celebration of the Elite Task Security & Service Agency at their training center in Laitkroh, Mawjrong, as special guests. The ceremony was attended by Shri A.N. Sawian, General Secretary; Ms. M.G.R. Shabong, Assistant General Secretary cum Coordinator; Mr. P. Deb, State Organizer cum First Aid Trainer; and Miss I. Swer, staff of the IRCS State Branch.
- On 15th March 2024, the Indian Red Cross Society Meghalaya State Branch celebrated "Coalesce 2024" at City Hut Dhaba, featuring a welcome song, discussions on the roles of life members, a presentation on Red Cross history, and a motivational speech by the Chairman.

Jammu & Kashmir

A. Blood Services

A total of 26 blood donation camps were organized, with 24 held in Jammu and 2 in Srinagar. These camps collected a total of 1,531 units of blood, with 1,420 units collected in Jammu and 111 units collected in Srinagar.

B. Relief activities and distribution

- (a) Ex-gratia assistance of Rs. 2 lakhs each was provided to the 10 next of kin of accident victims in Jhajjar Kotli, Jammu, totaling Rs. 20 lakhs.
- (b) Cash assistance totaling Rs. 2,95,500 was provided to 24 poor cancer, kidney, and heart patients.
- (c)Free sanitary napkins were distributed to 900 female beneficiaries.

C. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

Drug de-addiction efforts included 5 camps, benefiting 470 individuals.

- First Aid Awareness Camps (1 day)

- Jammu: 1,182 trained- Srinagar: 340 trained

- First Aid Training Programs (4 days and 8 days)

- Jammu: 1,522 trained- Srinagar: 468 trained

- Total Persons Trained in First Aid

- 555 trained in total

Between May 2023 and March 2024, a series of First Aid Awareness Camps were conducted across various locations in Jammu and Kashmir. These camps reached diverse groups, including trainees, students, staff, legal professionals, and drivers. Where a total of 1,522 participants benefited from this.

D. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

Junior Red Cross/Youth Red Cross organized 14 camps, benefiting 2,700 individuals.

E.Medical and Awareness Camps

A total of 853 diagnostic tests for various ailments were performed at the Diagnostic Centre (Lab.) at nominal charges.

F. Other Activities

The Family Welfare activities conducted by IRCS Jammu and Kashmir included treatment for 41 antenatal cases and administration of 8 TT ANC doses. They distributed 272 condoms, provided 14 cycles of oral pills, dispensed 22 packets of Chhaya tablets, and administered Inj. Antra as part of contraceptive services. Additionally, on March 3, 2024, IRCS administered a total of 489 Pulse Polio doses to children under 5 years old, with 265 doses in Jammu and 224 doses in Srinagar.

NAGALAND

The Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland (IRCSN) was formed in the year 1982 and ever since it has provided assistance, relief, and support to the people of Nagaland. The IRCSN has engaged in various disaster response, health and medical services, blood donations, and community welfare.

A. Blood Services

During Sewa Pakhwada, a Blood Donation Camp was held on 22nd September 2023 at Model College, Kohima, in collaboration with the Kohima District Blood Donors Association (KDBDA).

In collaboration with the Kohima District Blood Donors Association (KDBDA), a Blood Donation Camp was held at Kohima College, Kohima, on 1st October 2023, celebrating Voluntary Blood Donation Day.

B. Relief activities and distribution

- The President of IRCSN, Shri La. Ganesan, along with the Hon'ble Governor of Nagaland, launched an ambulance, marking a significant milestone in the organization's efforts to enhance healthcare infrastructure.
- On 5th March 2024, relief materials were provided to the owners of a burnt house, demonstrating humanitarian support during a time of crisis.
- On 20th March 2024, the Kohima District Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society handed relief materials and monetary assistance to fire victims in Kitsubozou, Kohima.
 The items were received by the Chairman on behalf of the victims.

C.Disaster Management Activities:

The Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA) organized a Capacity Building on Disaster Preparedness Training on 7th and 8th March 2024 at the Conference Hall, Cathedral Kohima, where the Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland State Branch provided a demonstration on First Aid.

D. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

- First Aid and CPR Training was provided to the staff of Kohima Mariani Transmission Ltd. (KMTL) in Zhadima.
- The Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland (IRCSN) State Branch, in collaboration with the Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland Mon District, organized a successful First Aid Training program on 13th October 2023. The training equipped 127 students with essential lifesaving skills.
- The Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland State Branch conducted a three-day First Aid and CPR training for 20 members at Dimapur Airport Fire Station from 29th to 31st January 2024, including participants from various states.
- A two-day First Aid and CPR training program was held on February 5th and 6th, 2024, at the PAWF Centre GX Studio, Opp. Chekiye Gate, Dimapur, with 11 fitness trainers from PAWF Nagaland actively participating.
- The Jalukie Sub-Branch, under the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS), conducted a First Aid Training on 26th October 2023.

E.SPECIAL VISITS AND MEETINGS

During the year 2023-2024, the IRCSN State Managing Committee met 10 times; 4 Quarterly meetings, 2 Sub-Committee meetings, and 7 Emergency meetings.

A Secretaries Meeting was held on 31st May 2023 at the Red Cross Complex. Secretaries from various districts attended the meeting, including representatives from Noklak, Tuensang, Peren, Dimapur, Mon, Longleng, Kiphire, Kohima, Tseminyu, Wokha, Mokokchung, and Phek.

The 36th Annual General Meeting of the Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland State Branch was held on 26th - 27th July 2023 at Raj Bhavan. The ceremonial function took place on 27th July 2023, with the Hon'ble Governor of Nagaland, who is also the President of IRCSN, and the Managing Committee Members of IRCSN in attendance.

F.Celebration of Important Days

On World Red Cross Day, 8th May 2023, First Aid Training was provided to students of G Rio School, Kohima. This event involved the Youth Red Cross and Junior Red Cross members and included the Hon'ble Governor of Nagaland, who is also the President of the Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland State Branch.

On Republic Day, 26th January 2024, the Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland State Branch visited the Kohima Leprosy Clinic in Mechozou, Nagabazar Kohima, distributing relief materials to patients.

G. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

The Junior Red Cross organized a cleanliness drive in Mon Town on 30th September 2023. Participants, including students and volunteers, gathered to clean public areas, promoting community hygiene and environmental awareness.

H.Medical and Awareness Camps

During the Hornbill Festival 2023, IRCSN participated actively, offering emergency services, and promoting Red Cross principles through informative standees, fostering health and safety awareness among festival attendees.

IRCS Mon, in collaboration with DAPCU, NTEP, DTCC, Mental Health, AFCH, and a medical team, conducted a Drugs and Mental Health seminar at Tizit. The seminar involved school children, teachers, police, and social workers, and it took place on 26th March 2023.

An orientation program on Red Cross was conducted for Managing Committee Members and staff of the Indian Red Cross Society Phek District, scheduled for 8th March 2024. The session aimed to educate participants about Red Cross principles, roles, and responsibilities for the period 2024-2026.

I. Other Activities

ODISHA

The Indian Red Cross Society, Odisha State Branch, is a leading and vibrant unit within the Red Cross movement. It is committed to nurturing moral values and promoting voluntary service among its volunteers. Through comprehensive training programs in first aid, disaster management, school and road safety, fire safety, HIV/AIDS awareness, WASH initiatives, and climate change, it equips volunteers and counselors with the skills needed to contribute effectively to society. This collective effort aims to establish a peaceful society and promote the well-being of all humanity.

A. Blood Services

A blood donation camp at ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel Beneficiation Plant in Keonjhar Dubona, jointly organized with the Indian Red Cross Organization, collected 74 units of blood and was inaugurated by Mr. RK Sharma and Mr. AR Khan.

B. Relief activities and distribution

- On May 5, 2023, school kits were distributed to students at SLS Residential School, Pahadpur, Mayurbhani district.
- On May 5, 2023, JRC volunteers warmly welcomed the Honorable President at Pahadpur, Mayurbhanj District. Relief materials were distributed to needy tribal communities, and school kits were provided to students at SLS School, Pahadpur.
- The Red Cross reached the unreached village of Dibakacha in Jashipur Panchayat, Rairangpur, Mayurbhanj, where essential facilities such as safe drinking water, nutritious food, healthcare, education, communication, and electricity are lacking. They also distributed essential items to the residents of the village.

C. Disaster Management Activities:

During the Bahanaga train collision on June 2, 2023, IRCS counselors provided crucial emergency services like first aid, crowd and dead body management, and organized blood donation camps across Balasore, Bhadrak, and Cuttack, supporting victims and rescue efforts effectively.

D. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

First Aid Lay Lecture Training sessions were conducted for JRC counselors at Red Cross Bhawan, Bhubaneswar, with three batches held on July 21-27, 2023 (26 participants), August 22-28, 2023 (23 participants), and October 12-18, 2023 (25 participants).

District-level JRC Study-cum-Training Camps were organized across 26 districts to enhance the skills of JRC volunteers and to select participants for the State-level camp.

E.SPECIAL VISITS AND MEETINGS

The JRC District Executive Committee Meeting for 2023-24 convened to strategize and coordinate activities, involving counselors, volunteers, and officials to plan and implement youth-focused humanitarian initiatives across the district.

• F.Celebration of Important Days

World Health Day, themed "Health for All," was commemorated on April 7, 2023, across all JRC Educational Districts. To celebrate this occasion, health awareness programs were conducted at the school level throughout the districts.

On the occasion of World Red Cross Day, commemorating the birth anniversary of Red Cross founder Jean Henry Dunant, volunteers and counselors of the Junior Red Cross from various schools participated in a special program. World Red Cross Day was also observed at the school level across all JRC districts.

- On June 5, 2023, World Environment Day was observed by JRC wings from various schools across
 the district through activities such as plantation drives, awareness rallies, and distribution of
 plants.
- On June 21, 2023, International Yoga Day was celebrated across all districts with yoga sessions
 organized at various schools. Yoga promotes physical, mental, and spiritual well-being among
 participants.
- On June 14, 2023, World Blood Donor Day was marked by the Indian Red Cross Society, Odisha State Branch, with a State-level Felicitation Program. Twelve JRC counselors from different districts were honored with the Blood Hero Award for their outstanding blood donations during the period from June 2022 to May 2023.
- On September 9, 2023, World First Aid Day was observed with the theme "First Aid in the Digital World." All JRC districts organized awareness camps at schools and communities to educate volunteers and community members on first aid techniques.
- World AIDS Day was observed on December 1, 2023, across all districts of Odisha with events held at different schools to raise awareness among students and community members about HIV/AIDS.

G. Junior / Youth Red Cross Activities:

JRC counselors and volunteers from Cuttack district joined together to provide various services during the event, including conducting a cleanliness drive.

The Junior Red Cross wing of the Indian Red Cross Society, Odisha State Branch, organized a First Aid Service Camp at the State-level children's festival SURAVI-2023. Emergency care was provided to injured or ill individuals at the JRC First Aid Stall during the event.

H.Medical and Awareness Camps

A social service camp was inaugurated on November 8, 2022, during Baliyatra in Cuttack, Bhadrak, and Sonepur, providing various services including first aid, stretcher assistance, cleanliness drives, blood donation, and awareness programs on health issues like HIV/AIDS and Dengue, benefiting thousands of attendees.

I.Other Activities

During the Ratha Yatra, JRC counselors from multiple districts joined the State branch to serve approximately 20 lakh devotees across Puri, Mayurbhanj, Kendrapara, Nabarangpur, and Dhenkanal, offering services like water distribution, first aid, and maintaining cleanliness.

C. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

- Conducted School Safety Program in different Government Primary Schools benefitting 17521 students & teachers.
- In the year 2023-24 Full 3 days First Aid Training were conducted at various corporate
 including government entities like Gujarat Environment Management Institute (GEMI)
 Lab and National Dairy Development Board, to multinational like. Godrej Infra, Torrent
 Research Centre, J.k Lakshmi cement, Chiripal group, Arvind group & Troika
 pharmaceutical. Also, demonstrations of CPR and basic awareness of First aid was
 conducted in public places li gardens and Riverfront area so that the public is
 benefited.
- First Aid Awareness and CPR training was conducted for school & College students respective through Junior Red Cross and Youth Red Cross program.

D. Junior/Youth Red Cross Activities:

With a view to make the youths to involve in more and more activities of Junior & Youth Red Cross prgoramme and thereby make them competent to contribute in the growth of our Nation, various activities for the year 2023-24 were planned.

E. Disaster Management Activities:

The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) accepted the request of Gujarat Red Cross and conducted Disaster Management Training in which trained 60 Red Cross Volunteers in two batches of 30 each. The trained volunteers would impart training to a large number of volunteers throughout the State. These volunteers are Eveready to render services during disasters. More than 33,000 volunteers have been enrolled who along with local people will be ready to move to the disaster hit areas on short notice to help the affected people.

G. Celebration of Important Days

• International Women's Day was celebrated by Youth Red Cross students. A drawing competition was also organized on the day.

H. Medical and Awareness Camps

- Gujarat State Branch of Indian Red Cross Society continued to provide physiotherapy services to the needy patients at concessional charge through its ISO certified Physiotherapy Centre. Qualified and experienced Physiotherapists provide physiotherapy to patients who are alling orthopedic, neurological and such other problems.
- Artificial Limb Centre is one of the major humanitarian services run by Gujarat Red Cross since 1972. Under the visionary leadership of our Chairmanshri- needy persons with disability (PWD) are being fitted/provided with Modular Technology Artificial Limb at subsidized rates More than 1700 beneficiaries across Gujarat along with neighboring states like Rajasthan, Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh have been fitted these appliances so far.
- Gujarat State Branch of IRCS continued the activities under Tuberculosis Project India during the year 2023-24 for controlling TB in Ahmedabad-both urban and Rural areas.

Tamil Nadu

A. Blood Services

The Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch operates a 24/7 state-of-the-art blood bank. organizing 67 camps and collecting 3,945 units of whole blood in 2023-2024. They prepared 8,578 blood components, issued 7.218 units to hospitals and nursing homes, and provided 1,173 units free to deserving cases referred by government hospitals.

B. Relief activities and distribution

- In March 2023, IRCS-TNB dispatched 300 hygiene kits to nine district branches and one subdistrict branch, and distributed 204 kits to Arasu Sevaillam in Tambaram
