

INDIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY: AN INTRODUCTION

The Indian Red Cross is a voluntary humanitarian organization having a network of over 1100 branches throughout the country, providing relief in times of disasters/emergencies and promotes health & care of the vulnerable people and communities. It is a leading member of the largest independent humanitarian organization in the world, the International Red Cross & Red Crescent Movement. The Movement has three main components, the International Committee of Red Cross (ICRC), 192 National Societies and International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC).

The Mission of the Indian Red Cross is to inspire, encourage and initiate at all times all forms of humanitarian activities so that human suffering can be minimized and even alleviated and thus contribute to creating more congenial climate for peace.

- Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) was established in 1920 under the Indian Red Cross Society Act and incorporated under Parliament Act XV of 1920.
- The IRCS has 36 State/Union Territory Branches with their more than 1100 district and sub district branches.
- Hon'ble President of India is the President and Hon'ble Union Health Minister is the Chairman of the Society.
- The Vice Chairman is elected by the members of the Managing Body.
- The National Managing Body consists of 19 members, including the Chairman.
- The Chairman and 6 members are nominated by the President. The remaining 12 are elected by the state and union territory branches through an electoral college.
- The Managing Body is responsible for governance and supervision of the functions of the society through several committees.
- The Secretary General is the Chief Executive officer of the Society.

DISASTER RECOVERY & RESPONSE

This section provides an overview of our activities and achievements in the areas of disaster response and recovery during the year.

During the year, IRCS responded to several emergencies in various parts of the country, including natural disasters, such as floods and earthquakes, and man-made disasters, such as conflicts and pandemics. Our teams provided critical assistance to affected communities, including shelter, food, water, sanitation, and health services.

In addition to our emergency response efforts, IRCS also focused on building the capacity of communities and local partners to prepare for and respond to disasters. We conducted training sessions on disaster preparedness and response, community-based first aid, and psychosocial support to empower individuals and communities to be better prepared for disasters.

During the year heavy rainfall, cyclone, cold wave and incidents of fire affected many parts of the country. State/UT branches namely Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Gujarat, Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala, West Bengal, Uttarakhand, Telangana, TamilNadu, Puducherry, Ladakh, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand were affected badly by floods, cold wave, fires, and cyclones. IRCS immediately responded to the disasters and dispatched relief materials from existing stocks at different warehouse.

Major Highlights:

• Hon'ble Chairman IRCS & Minister of Health & Family Welfare Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya flagged off Red Cross supplies of blankets, medicines & other relief material for the people of Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh & Uttarakhand on 29th October, 2021. The flag off function was held at Nirman Bhawan.







CYCLONE TAUKTAE and YAAS; During the FY 2021-22, the situation became critical with the landfall of cyclone YAAS & TAUKATE affecting millions of people in coastal regions of India. Cyclonic storm 'Tauktae' affected five States namely Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka, Kerala and one UT of Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu (DNH&DD), and Cyclone 'Yaas' affected three States namely Odisha, West Bengal and Jharkhand.





IRCS emergency response teams worked alongside the govt. authorities to evacuate people at-risk in coastal areas, providing first aid & relief items, such as tarpaulins, kitchen sets, hygiene kits & buckets etc. following critical COVID-19 prevention measures.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

The COVID-19 pandemic presented unprecedented challenges to our operations, but we quickly adapted our programs to respond to the crisis. We scaled up our preparedness and response to tackle the Corona pandemic by initiating a myriad of activities, including distributing food, dry ration, blankets, hygiene kits, masks, sanitizers, gloves, PPE kits, test kits, ventilators, oxygen concentrators, oximeters, etc. During the outbreak, volunteers were trained and awareness & prevention programs were conducted to sensitize vulnerable communities. During the pandemic, IRCS was also designated by



Govt. of India as the sole consignee for all the foreign aid in kind. The global community, which includes the governments of several countries, partner National Red Cross & Red Crescent Societies, IFRC, ICRC, associations of Indians living abroad and People of Indian Origin (PIO) extended their helping hand in supporting the efforts in the country in its fight against the pandemic.

Foreign aid from several countries and individuals during Second Wave of COVID-19 Pandemic

- During April-June, 2021, India suffered the second wave of Covid-19. During that period the management of human resources was also a challenge and management of foreign donation was a huge task at that time. To manage this crisis, a Covid task force was set up under the leadership of Secretary, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare with the representative from the major stakeholders including IRCS. IRCS was also appointed as consignee of behalf of Govt. of India for receiving the international aid during Covid-19.
- IRCS (NHQ) successfully & smoothly got custom clearance of every consignment with minimum delay and handed over the supplies to HLL, the logistic partner of MoHFW, for further distribution.
- A team of two officers, one each from the Ministry and IRCS (NHQ), worked hard to manage and handle traffic data support information of flights, liaison with donors, foreign embassies, MoEA, Niti Aayog for completion of desired paper works for custom clearance, coordination with other stakeholders deputed at various airports, maintaining master database and tracking sheet and liaison with MoHFW and HLL and documenting other best practices and procedures adopted during the emergency situation. The task was very hectic and required enhanced interpersonal relations, patience and mutual cooperation.
- From April- June 2021, India started receiving supplies of Oxygen Cylinders, Ventilators, Oxygen Generation Plant, Oximeters, Oxygen Concentrators, lifesaving drugs like Remdesivir, Tocilizumab and many other preventive medical relief items from nearby 53 countries. This task of receiving aid, as a sole consignee was undertaken to the entire satisfaction of all the stakeholders.

Highlights

- > Over 50,000 volunteers were on front with medical and other humanitarian supplies.
- All American Physicists of Indian Origin (AAPI), All American Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPI), OPPO India, Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), Air Bus Foundation, JIAN- YUYUE, Federation of Indian Association (US) and several other associations, groups, and others donated oxygen-related equipment, oximeter, and masks etc. to IRCS, NHQ.
- To assist the patients, several branches established Oxygen Concentrator Banks and oxygen plants.
- > 80 oxygen cylinders were provided under covid response to Red Cross hospital in Seemapuri, New Delhi.
- In response to global appeal launched by IFRC, Geneva, the IFRC received about INR 164 crores. IFRC logistics team made purchases and delivered agreed items to IRCS in kind. They drafted a National Society Domestic Response Plans (NSRP) under which following procurements were made and the supplies started.
- ➤ 114 vehicles consisting of negative pressure ambulances, ALS ambulances, BLS ambulances, blood collection vans and testing/mobile clinic vans.
- Equipping all existing blood centers.
- > Equipment supports for new blood banks.
 - 3,49,000 Hygiene Kits,
 - 1,00,000 Tarpaulins,
 - 1,00,000 Blankets,
 - 75,000 Kitchen Sets,
 - 10,000 Jackets
 - 2000 Oxygen Concentrators.
- Additionally, ventilators and oxygen concentrators were donated by other National Societies.
- With the assistance of the Canadian government, the Canadian Red Cross has donated one large oxygen plant and fifteen smaller oxygen plants to Red Cross and other free service providing hospitals in the country.
- Personal protective material distribution by the branches included over 1.50 crores of face masks, 2 lakh PPE kits/gowns, 1.50 lakh hygiene kits, 20 lakh soaps, 18 lakh liters of sanitizers etc.



The branches through their volunteers also distributed/ provided over 3 crore cooked meals/food packets. The branches also distributed medicines worth Rs. 45 lakhs, ran 77 quarantine and isolation centers, vaccinated more than 10 lakh people and helped perform over 6.50 lakh covid tests.

- In total, 4,240 blood donation camps were held during the second wave, and more than 2.65 lakh units of blood were collected. The branches also put 250 ambulances into action and provided medical care for patients at their 98 hospitals, PHCs and polyclinics.
- Red Cross ran 219 helplines and its medical units provided medical consultation to 3.35 lakh people and 3.57 lakh people were provided psychosocial support.
- The volunteers sanitized nearly 5000 buildings. Some of the branches also distributed more than 1.50 lakh medicine kits.



IRCS promoted community awareness of COVID19 and immunisation, including handwashing demonstrations, and assisted individuals in accessing immunizations through the state governments' vaccination programme.

Data for the year 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.

IRCS made the arrangements for distribution of Covid 19 response items valued at approx. INR 4,847 crores to State/UT branches and hospitals etc. as decided by the Govt. The items were mainly oxygen cylinder, oxygen container tanks, oxygen plants, oxygen concentrators, trollies, ventilators, oximeters, drugs (Fabipiravir / Coronavir, Remedisiv), masks, face shields, sanitizers, cannula etc.

LOOKING AHEAD:

As we reflect on the achievements of the year, we also recognize the need to continue to build our capacity to better serve communities affected by disasters. We will focus on enhancing our response mechanisms, building partnerships with new stakeholders, and strengthening our advocacy efforts to promote disaster risk reduction and preparedness.

We are proud of the achievements of the IRCS Disaster Recovery & Response team during the year, and we would like to thank our donors, partners, and staff for their unwavering support. With their continued support, we are committed to serving communities affected by disasters, promoting resilience, and building a more disaster prepared world.

BLOOD SERVICES

The Blood Services program of the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) continued to be a significant area of focus during the year 2021-22. The program played a crucial role in ensuring an adequate supply of safe blood and blood products to patients in need, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Transfusion of blood is an essential part of modern health care management. The first Blood Centre was started in India by Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) in 1942 at All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health, Calcutta (West Bengal). IRCS has a robust blood processing and testing infrastructure, with over 97 blood banks across 15 States/ UTs and blood storage centers across the country. During the year, IRCS continued to invest in modernizing its blood processing and testing facilities, ensuring the safety and quality of blood and blood products. Over 5 lakh people donated blood at IRCS Blood Banks across the country in the year 2021-22 and



over 12 lakh people were motivated through blood donation drives of our IRCS branches across the country.

With a modest start in a house in Jorbagh, in 1977, the blood Centre started operating from the Indian Red Cross Society, National Headquarters (IRCS, NHQ). The Blood Centre is running round the clock and provides the services to the needy patients. It was designated as Regional Blood Centre by State Govt. in 1996 and has been designated as Model Blood Bank in 2010 by National AIDS Control Organization, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India and is Certified by the BIS for ISO 9001:2015 and accredited by NABH &NABL.

This Blood Centre focuses on encouraging voluntary blood donations. It collects approximately 30,000 units of blood annually which contributes about 10% of the total blood collected in Delhi. The percentage of voluntary blood collection is almost 100% in IRCS Blood Centre. The Blood Centre provides about 70% of total collection of blood free of service charges to the patients admitted in Govt. Hospitals in Delhi, HIV/AIDS patients, patients below poverty line, thalassaemia patients, haemophilia patients and sickle cell anemia patients. 975 thalassaemic patients are registered with IRCS, NHQ (which is about 50% of all the thalassaemics in Delhi).

The IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre is fully equipped to collect blood at its premises and also has mobile teams, which go out frequently to hold Blood Donation Camps. The blood, after collection, is tested for HIV I & II, HBs Ag, HCV, VDRL & Malaria. Blood grouping with Rh D and Antibodies Testing (three cell panel) is done by fully automated advance technology. To ensure effective utilization of blood, besides supplying whole blood, Red Cross also has the facility of component separation that provides different components of blood, like fresh frozen plasma, platelet rich plasma, platelet concentrate, packed cells, cryoprecipitate and platelet aphaeresis.

Blood Donation Camps:

Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, IRCS continued to organize blood donation camps across the country, with safety measures in place to protect donors and staff. These camps were critical in maintaining an adequate supply of blood and blood products for patients in need. IRCS also collaborated with corporate partners and other organizations to organize blood donation drives, resulting in an increase in the number of donors.

Highlights of major camps: -

- 1133 blood donors were provided by Sant Nirankari Mandal in 19 camps during Covid pandemic.
- Blood Donation Camp was organized by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare on the occasion of National Voluntary Blood Donation Day-1st Oct. 21. A total number of 113 blood units were collected.
- A total number of 844 units were collected from the volunteers in a camp conducted in BITS, Pilani, Rajasthan, from 25th to 28th March 2022. This has been an annual feature for the last over 3 decades.
- 12858 units of blood were issued against processing charges to the patients admitted in private hospitals/ nursing homes.
- IRCS, NHQ Blood Centre in Delhi, as well as all 97 blood centers across the country, since
 the start of the Covid pandemic, made tireless efforts to maintain a steady supply of safe
 blood to Thalassemia, Cancer and other needy patients.
- During Dengue Viral Haemorrhagic fever the demand for platelets increased manifolds. IRCS, NHQ Blood Centre organised blood donation camps and prepared lifesaving platelet concentrates and issued to both Government and Private hospitals in and around Delhi round the clock for patients.
- IRCS, NHQ initiated process to start 20 New Blood Centers across the country.
- During the year 2021-22, Blood Centre, Indian Red Cross Society at National Headquarter collected a total of 22362 units of blood from voluntary blood donors. A total of 290 Blood Donation Camps were conducted in various places like Educational Institutions, Corporate Sectors, Religious/Social Organizations, and other offices.
- During the year 2021-22, 28727 Blood/Blood components were prepared. The total 15869 units of blood components were issued free of cost to the patients admitted in Government Hospitals, thalassaemic and haemophilic patients.

The aim of the organization is to phase out replacement donors and achieve 100% voluntary blood donation in the country. Details of blood units collected and number of camps held during the last five years are given in the following tables:

Screening, Processing & Storage of Blood

Blood is tested for infectious diseases (TTIs) such as HIV, HBs Ag, VDRL & HCV and blood group serology. The screening of Transfusion Transmitted Infectious Marker (TTIs) is done by ELISA Method.

Thalassemia: In Delhi, there are about 2000 registered thalassemic patients who are receiving blood from various Regional Centers like AIIMS, RML Hospital, Hindu Rao Hospital, LNJP Hospital, GTB Hospital and private blood banks. Out of them 975 patients are registered with Red Cross Blood Centre and more than 200 registered patients are from outside Delhi. IRCS continues to look after approx. 50% of the thalassemic patients in and around Delhi and provides Blood/Blood Components to them.

<u>Support to National Plasma Fractionation Centre (NPFC):</u> IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre is a NACO supported blood component Separation Unit. As per NACO guidelines IRCS, Blood Centre has largely supported the Reliance Life Sciences Pvt. Ltd. by sending the surplus Plasma/FFP for fractionation. In the year 2021-22, IRCS (NHQ), Blood Centre has issued about 20680 units of surplus plasma/FFP to Reliance Life Sciences Pvt. Ltd.

Certificate of accreditation for ISO by BIS, NABH and NABL: The IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre has been certified by IS/ISO 9001:2015, NABH and NABL w.e.f 2012 and 2013. Routine surveillance audit for the accreditation has been conducted by the auditor team in 2021-22 by BIS, NABL and NABH for renewal of accreditation.

External Quality Assurance Programme (EQAS): IRCS (NHQ) Blood Centre has been enrolled with SDMH, Jaipur, (BEQAS), CMC Vellore, AIIMS and Mumbai Red Cross for proficiency for infectious marker and serology testing.

The following specific activities were carried out during lockdown due to COVID-19pandemic:

- Provided pick and drop facilities The IRCS, NHQ Blood Centre provided pick and drop facility to individual blood donors in Red Cross as well as in blood donation camps, took mobile blood collection vans to residential areas to conduct blood camps, conducted awareness campaigns through social media to break the myths regarding blood donation during COVID-19 and ensured all COVID safety precautions were being followed for the safety of staff and donors.
- Safety Measure IRCS (NHQ) provided the Safety Measures such as PPE Kit to Doctors and Phlebotomist, disposables gown, sanitizer, mask, gloves, shoe cover, head cap, soap etc. were also distributed to the IRCS staff members and Blood Donors at the blood donation camps in and around Delhi. Provided e-passes facility during lockdown to the voluntary blood donors to encourage them to travel to the blood centre for blood donation.

Nucleic Acid Testing (NAT) Testing Facility

Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare and Chairman of the IRCS, NHQ, inaugurated a Nucleic Acid Testing (NAT) Facility at the IRCS NHQ Blood Centre on March 20, 2021.

NAT equipment with lab. was installed at IRCS, NHQ in accordance with the MoU signed between IRCS and Thalassemic India. From January 21 to March 22, the NAT equipment was operational and performed 12111 tests.

Training: Trainings were provided by IRCS (NHQ), Blood Centre to Doctors, Lab. Technicians of Govt. Hospitals and Interns from different Institutions to enrich their knowledge on overview of procedures for testing in blood services, safety parameters & transfusion quality management system (TQMS) related. The visit facilitates the Blood Banks in strengthening the standards of Blood Services which were learnt during the training period and spreads awareness while enlightening the students for blood donations.

Trainings were imparted on: Automated Cell counter, Automated Blood grouping technique, transfusion transmitted infections (TTIs), ADR monitoring, Blood component preparation, Plasma components and documentation of processes.

Celebration of World Blood Donor Day

A one-week programme (14.06.21 to 20.6.2021) was organised to increase the number of voluntary blood donations by disseminating the benefits of voluntary blood donation to the public.

Celebration of National Blood Donation Day

A blood donation camp was held at the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Nirman Bhawan, on the occasion of Voluntary Blood Donation Day on October 1, 2021. The event was inaugurated by the Union Health Secretary, and the Director General of Health Services. 113 people donated blood.

Of late IRCS, NHQ has been gradually moving towards digitization. In the field of membership as well it has been implemented. As per the new system, the branches are required to upload the names & other details of the enrolled members using a link at NHQ website.

IRCS organized several fundraising activities during the year, including appeals through website, social media platforms, and other channels. We also organized special campaigns to support our COVID-19

response efforts, which received a significant response from our donors. The organization also received generous support from individual donors, corporate partners, and international organizations.

We are grateful for the support of our donors, members, and partners during the year 2021-22, and we look forward to their continued support in the years to come. With their support, we are confident that we can continue to provide services to vulnerable populations across the country.

FIRST AID TRAINING

The First Aid training program of the Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) continued to be an essential area of focus during the year 2021-22. The program played a crucial role in building the capacity of individuals and communities to respond effectively to emergencies and disasters.

Despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, IRCS continued to conduct first aid training programs across the country, with safety measures in place to protect trainers and trainees. Special guidelines on conduct of first aid trainings during covid-19 pandemic were issued by NHQ. The number of trainees in a batch was reduced to 12 from 30 and the period of training was reduced to 4 days from 8 days. The duration of the training was increased to 24 hours from 16 hours. Guidelines on covid sensitive behaviour were also issued.

During the year 2021-22 over 70,000 people were trained in First Aid across the country.

IRCS continued to collaborate with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) and other partners to share best practices and enhance its first aid training programs. These collaborations allowed us to learn from the experiences of other countries and improve the quality of our programs.

MASTER TRAINERS IN FIRST AID

IRCS imparts training in First Aid for the benefit of general public and employees of companies, factories, corporates and others through its branches. The trainings are imparted by Instructors/Lay Lecturers authorized by the National Headquarters for the purpose. The Instructors/Lay Lecturers are assessed for their efficiency periodically by Master Trainers deputed by the National Headquarters. Master Trainers are selected by the National Headquarters from among the Instructors/ Lay Lecturers on the basis of their extra ability and mastery over the subject.

IRCS has 53 Master Trainers during the period 2021-2022. The services of Master Trainers are availed for assessment of Instructors/Lay Lecturers and also for the assessment of trainees in First Aid.

INTERNATIONAL MOVEMENT COOPERATION

The Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) continued to work closely with the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement during the year 2021-22. The International Movement Cooperation program played a critical role in strengthening our relationships with other National Societies and partners around the world.

IRCS collaborated with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) and International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) to respond to disasters and emergencies, share best practices, and learn from the experiences of other countries. These collaborations allowed us to enhance our programs and services and better serve vulnerable populations across the country.

IRCS-ICRC COOPERATION ACTIVITY

- Indian Red Cross Society was supported by ICRC in its COVID response in the country. The items provided included hand sanitizers, face masks & face shields, dead body safety bags etc. ICRC has also devised a road map to provide digitalization support at IRCS. It also provided state of art intercom facility at National Headquarters and set up video confrencing facility at seven IRCS Branches.
- First Aid is the first assistance or aid or treatment given to a patient in an emergency. IRCS has conducted First Aid training in states like Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Bihar and Delhi etc. ICRC has provided technical and financial support to the First Aid training.

In financial year 2021-22, IRCS has handled 4 Tracing requests of Sri Lankan Red Cross and exchanged 89 Red Cross messages between sender and addressee. Due to Covid 19 pandemic, there was no activity in field level, as per agreed plan of action. However, HR support has been provided under the IRCS-ICRC annual plan of action.

YOUTH PROGRAM

Program Background

IRCS NHQ and branches have been running Junior and Youth Red Cross activities since early 1920's. Juniors are the students in the schools registered under the programme. Similarly, Youth are the members that are enrolled through their colleges registered by the Red Cross branches at the local level. The programme has a very large membership as most of the Govt. run schools are covered. This is one of the core areas of Red Cross activities throughout the world.

IRCS injected fresh life into the Youth Programme with the support of ICRC in schools/colleges and communities in the selected State Branches. The target states for this programme were Maharashtra, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Telangana and Jammu & Kashmir. This program has three

key objectives -

- To enhance the understanding of the Red Cross Red Crescent Movement and its Fundamental Principles.
- Promote peace and harmony among the youth and the selected communities.
- To strengthen the capacity of the YRC regarding hygiene promotion, household water treatment, basic first- aid and promote peace and harmony in society.
- To contribute towards increasing the awareness on role of youth and behavioral changes in the selected communities on hygiene promotion, household water treatment and basic first aid.

IRCS Andhra Pradesh; Junior and Youth Red Cross activities:

Key activities held during the FY 2021-2022:

1. Junior/Youth Red Cross is one of the major activities of the A.P. State Branch. The branch conducted a J/YRC membership drive to enroll students. The activities aimed at promoting a spirit of service in the community and create awareness on road safety, first aid and behavior change activities in the state.



JRC had 2962 no. of institutions and 1459152 members were enrolled in the FY 21-22, while YRC had 465 number of institutions and 589081 members were enrolled. As a result, the total number of institutions were 3427 and 2048233 members were enrolled.

2. Young Red Crossers planted 3.5 lakh saplings throughout the state as per guidelines of IRCS A.P. State Branch.

3. Ananthapuramu & Vizayanagaram district branches organized Aayushman Bharat Arogya Mela (Health Camp) at Anantapur with the motto 'Guaranteed to Health-Progress'.

4. Under the guidance of Hon'ble Governor IRCS, A.P State Branch launched "One Million Blood Grouping" program covering all colleges and youth in the state. Due to rise in the covid cases the state branch was unable to achieve the target.



 During the second wave of Covid 7,414 YRC volunteers distributed face masks, PPE kits, oximeters, dry foods, ration kits and gloves amongst the needy and vulnerable.



6. During the Sankranti Festival in Vijayawada, youth Red Cross volunteers assisted the elderly and disabled in their travel to temple at Kanaka Gurga Temple.

IRCS Odisha Junior and Youth Red Cross activities

 The YRC Volunteers and members of the YUVA RED CROSS BAHINI of numerous universities in Odisha organized workshops and campaigns on maintaining social distance, practicing hand hygiene, wearing masks, covid vaccination and other activities to combat the widespread concern and threat of COVID-19 during second wave.

2. YRC members helped in organizing blood donation camps in various locations. Volunteers also assisted in the management of the Quarantine Centre. YRC, Odisha also assisted stranded people from various parts of India in reaching out to their families during the lockdown, with the permission of the local authorities.

- 3. YRC/JRC members & counselors in partnership with the State Transport Authority, Cuttack, executed "Project Rakshyak" and provided this training to over 30,000 persons.
- 4. Webinar was held for YRC District Co-Ordinators on 29th June 2021 during Van Mahotsav Week 2021.



- 5. YRC, Odisha had imparted Social Emergency Response Volunteers (SERV) Training to 320 YRC Volunteers at three major disaster affected districts of Odisha namely: Balasore, Bhadrak & Mayurbhanj at 12 different venues.
- 6. IRCS, Odisha state and district branches celebrated important days like; National Youth Day, World AIDS Day, International First aid Day and World Blood Donor Day etc.









IRCS Maharashtra: Junior and Youth Red Cross activities

The Junior Red Cross activities were carried out in Mumbai City as well as at Bhandara, Pune, Jalgaon, Nashik, Kolhapur and Raigad districts. In the year 2021-22 there were Junior Red Cross units in 185 schools and Youth Red Cross groups in 46 colleges with a total member ship of 1,43,580 juniors and 16,054 youth.



- Online Webinars for Youth & Juniors: Youth Red Cross, Maharashtra, took the initiative of taking online webinars with experts facilitators. They made power point presentations and audio-visual presentations on various topics like health, hygiene, Red Cross movement, role of youth in Red Cross and environment etc.
- Youth Red Cross (YRC) organized an experimental learning webinar workshop on "Planning and Prioritization on 2nd May 2021 by Ms. Rochelle Aranha, HR Professional, the Boston Consulting Group. The webinar focused on aspects of time management, planning and prioritization. 60 people attended the webinar.

HEALTH PROGRAMS

TB PROJECT

Introduction:

Tuberculosis (TB) is one of India's major public health problems. According to WHO estimates, India has the world's largest number of tuberculosis patients. Indian Red Cross Society (IRCS) is playing an increasingly important role in ensuring that TB cases are treated successfully and find out ways & means to minimize stigma and discrimination against patients. With the aim to reduce the burden of MDR TB, IRCS addresses needs of the vulnerable people, arranges for the retreatment of patients and engages with those patients who are likely to default. While undergoing treatment these patients are being followed up and supported to enable full adherence to DOTs. Since 2009, IRCS has been working in support of TB patient in targeted communities in some states.



During the year 2021-2022, nearly 2800 patients were covered in the project districts in the states of Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Punjab and UP with the adherence rate of above 95%. The project covered awareness meetings, care and support, patient counseling, IEC activities & discussion sessions at the government health facilities at their TB units & door to door services. Health checkup & TB screening camps were also organized.

Goals and Objectives:

- To ensure that TB patients, i.e. those who have stopped DOTs treatment without completion, are put back on treatment until they are cured.
- To ensure effectiveness of treatment by providing care and nutritional support to the most vulnerable TB cases.
- Prevention of Multi Drug Resistant TB.
- To reduce the number of deaths, illness and impact from Tuberculosis and MDR TB in target areas.
- To reduce the prevalent stigma and discrimination around TB through behavior change communication campaign and inclusion of TB patients on important platforms.

Haryana

The TB Programme was extended in the year 2021-22 under which a target of 300 TB patients was kept in the districts of Faridabad and Palwal. During the year 2021-22, 508 TB patients were enrolled in Faridabad & Palwal districts, out of which 344 were cured, 5 transferred out, 2 failures, 8 deaths, 6 defaulters and 143 were under treatment as on 31st March, 2022.

Proper attention was paid on awareness activities during the year. In this regard, 23 advocacy awareness meetings and 118 Mohalla Meetings were arranged in Faridabad & Palwal by the Red Cross volunteers and the District Coordinators so that the TB suspects living very close to the TB patients and others in surrounding areas should come forward for early diagnosis & treatment. Hand bills on TB were distributed in the community. The volunteers held 1381 and 200 counselling sessions at DOTS centers in Faridabad and Palwal respectively. 2439 and 861 home visits were made by Faridabad and Palwal district coordinators and volunteers.

Karnataka

The Karnataka State Branch set a target of 300 TB patients for the TB Programme 2021-22. (100 in each district of Bangalore, Mandya, and Tumkur). During the fiscal year 2021-22, there were no activities in Bangalore and Tumkur district branches. As a result, the state branch only sent the Mandya district's annual report. As on March 31, 2022, 225 TB patients had been enrolled in the Mandya district, with 148 cured, 2 failures, 3 deaths, 1 default, and



74 still receiving treatment. 6 awareness/outreach sessions were held, 190 households were visited, 1500 pieces of IEC material were distributed and individual and group counselling sessions were also held.

EMERGENCY HEALTH RESPONSE SENSITIZATION PROGRAM

IRCS has launched a sensitization program on "Emergency Health Response" spread over 7 days (3 hours per day). This program primarily aimed to fill the gap of patient care attendants who would work under the supervision of paramedics. It is also desired through this program to engage underprivileged youths of society in useful activities.

While Indian Red Cross Society is a technical partner in this endeavor, ground implementation is accomplished by Sewa Bharati and National Medicos Organization. Approximately 732 candidates have been covered through EHR sensitization Program.

Flood Early Warning Project

IRCS has embarked on a community-based flood EW alert system project in Assam and Bihar. Based on verified data from Google the flood alert system aims to inform people at risk to take actions to save their lives and livelihoods. This project is being implemented by IRCS and being supported by Google.



Around 1100 volunteers owning smart phones were trained in the states of Assam and Bihar. Under the project, 225 Ward Contingency Plans in Assam and 62 in Bihar have been prepared. A team of trained IRCS volunteers started receiving flood alerts during the monsoon period in 2021 and immediately disseminated information through phone calls, WhatsApp groups and door-to-door canvassing within concerned communities. More than 90 such alerts in Bihar and above 40 alerts were broadcast in Assam through volunteers in 2021. In addition, 350 volunteers of UNICEF were trained in flood alert literacy in 2022 in Bihar.

EcoDRR Project

The Ecosystem based disaster risk reduction (Eco-DRR) India project aims to reduce water-related risks in Banaskantha district, of Gujarat by implementation of contextual EcoDRR measures like Training and Capacity Building of Gram Panchayats, Women Farmers, Self Help Groups and CBOs on agroforestry, Water Harvesting, Soil Mulching and Drought. Fund amounting to Rs 25,05,382 was supported by IFRC to implement the EcoDRR project in Gujarat state branch.

REPORTS FROM THE BRANCHES

ANDHRA PRADESH

The IRCS, APSB has been in the forefront in providing assistance and relief, during natural and man-made disasters, in training communities for disaster preparedness and response, in promoting health education and health care, in supporting the differently abled, and in enthusing the youth of the State to serve those in need through its Junior and Youth Red Cross volunteers. 13 District Branches and 196 Sub District Branches of IRCS are functioning in Andhra Pradesh State.



Activities undertaken by the branch during FY 21-22 are as under:

1. IRCS A.P. State Branch & the JRC/YRC Sub-Committee decided to enroll a minimum of 10 lakh members under JRC/YRC in the year 2021-2022.To achieve it 2962 schools were registered with an enrolment of 14,59,152 students under Junior Red Cross, and 465 colleges were registered with an enrolment of 5,89,081 students under Youth Red Cross during the year 2021-22.

Blood Services

- 2. IRCS APSB started blood grouping program. Chairman, APSB launched the program at Maris Stella College, Vijayawada on 1st December 2021 on World AIDS Day. 62312 blood groupings had been done during the FY 2021-22.
- 3. During the FY 2021-22 the IRCS state branch conducted 854 blood donation camps and collected 54,303 units of blood.



4. 211 Thalessmia patients were registered during this year and 4615 units of blood was issued free of cost to the Thalessmia patients during the year 2020-21.

5. Thalassemia Centre, West Godavari district has provided 921 units of blood for free transfusion to thalassemia patients in the year 2021-22.

Covid -19 Response

- 6. Total 7,414 Red Cross volunteers rendered services during 2nd Wave of Covid-19 pandemic.
- 7. Established free 24/7 IRCS covid helpline service with a team of 100 doctors and extended psychosocial care services to the needy. Developed a medicine kit to support home isolated covid patients with the support of experts and prepared and distributed 19,689 free covid medicine kits in 13 district branches with the support of NRI organizations and local philanthropists. IRCS, A. P. State Branch had started 57 helpline centers in 13 district branches. Through helpline, 54,321 people have taken medical consultation and 62,545 people have taken psychosocial support.
- 8. Due to Covid -19 Pandemic, for the relief measures, an amount of Rs. 25,00,000/- (Twenty-Five Lakhs) was received from Hon'ble Governor & President of Indian Red Cross Society, Andhra Pradesh State Branch for the distribution of relief material to the flood affected Districts of IRCS- Nellore, Chittoor and Kadapa District Branches.
- 9. Hon'ble Governor and President of the IRCS, AP State Branch interacted through Video Conferencing with the IRCS, District Branch representatives at 11.30 am on 12.04.2021 from Rajbhavan, Vijayawada along with APSB committee on the preparedness of IRCS, District Branches to create awareness among the people on Covid appropriate behavior.
- 10. Andhra Pradesh Chief Secretary Shri. Adityanath Das, I.A.S., Special Chief Secretary to the Government, launched a distribution programme for oxygen concentrators and ventilators donated by Singapore Red Cross.
- 11. Distributed 3.17 lakh face masks to needy people in Andhra Pradesh.
- 12. Distributed 2076 personal protect emergency equipment (PPE) Kits.
- 13. Distributed 1400 pulse oximeters to the front-line worriers.
- 14. Distributed 8,713 dry ration kits to the migrant laborers at various places.
- 15. Distributed grocery kits (8711) to poor and needy families at Guntur, Nellore.
- 16. The IRCS Chittoor district branch distributed dry ration kits to 250 families with the support of IRCS- APSB.
- 17. Provided free meals and beverages to the Covid patient attendants and the poor at Guntur, Srikakulam & Krishna Districts and nearly 2.6 lakh people were covered.
- 18. Distributed 36,356 gloves to the sanitary workers in 13 Districts of Andhra Pradesh with the support of Reliance Foundation.

- 19. Continued awareness programmes on proper wearing of masks, sanitization, social distancing and vaccination across the state every day.
- 20. Maintained quarantine centers and supported vaccination centers.
- 21. All the district collectors had given task to the Red Cross to motivate more people for vaccination. Total 50,129 people were vaccinated.
- 22. All the District Collectors had given task to the Red Cross to motivate more people for Covid Testing. Total 45,562 people undergone Covid Test due to the counseling by Red Cross.
- 23. Helped in the cremation of Covid caused dead bodies and unattended dead bodies at Srikakulam, East Godavari & Nellore.
- 24. IRCS A.P. State Branch allotted oxygen concentrators of 5 & 10 liters which were donated by Telugu Association of North America (TANA), North American Telugu Association (NATA), American Telugu Association (ATA), Telugu Association of Malaysia (TAM), American Association of Physicians of Indian origin (AAPI) and Singapore Red Cross to 13 IRCS district branches. 427 COVID emergency patients had utilized oxygen concentrators through IRCS district branches.

Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

- 25. IRCS-APSB has organized capacity-building activities in the (9) Coastal District Branches of A.P. State for key Line Officers at District Emergency Operation Centre in each district. Total 401 key line officers have participated in the above (9) trainings in their respective districts.
- 26. During the year 2021-22, District Branches conducted 212 one-day Basic First Aid trainings and 149 Senior Professional First Aid training programmes. Totally, 361 First Aid training programmes were conducted in all Districts, covering 7,875 Students and Employees from various sectors and companies.
- 27. According to the Letter of Authorization (LOA) received from M/S.PGCIL for conducting one-day Basic Training on "First Aid Training" in 11 PGCIL locations in Andhra Pradesh were conducted.
- 28. The IRCS, West Godavari District Branch is running one Multi-Purpose Health Workers Training Institute (MPHW) since 1986, on 100% Grant-in-Aid basis. 85 candidates have been trained during 2020-21.

Other Activities

- 29. The Kalyan Magatapalli Eye donation Centre at Visakhapatnam was started in 2008. During the year 2021-22 the Eye donation Centre collected 16 cornea from 8 eye donors and handed over to M/s. Mohsin Eye Bank, Visakhapatnam.
- 30. On the eve of International Disaster Risk Reduction Day i.e., on 13.10.2021, all the 13 District Branches conducted an awareness program on Disaster Risk Reduction to AASHA Workers/SERV/Panchayat Secretaries, Grama Volunteers, and Sachivalaya Secretaries at their respective areas in their District Branches.

- 31. The JRC/YRC Sub Committee decided to plant 2.5 lakh saplings in coordination with Forest Department in the respective districts. 353769 lakh plantations were done during the FY 2021-22.
- 32. 256 women were trained at sewing centers run in Srikakulam, East Godavari and Kurnool districts.
- 33. The IRCS, Visakhapatnam District Branch operates two-night shelters in the district of Visakhapatnam at Peda Walter and Maharanipeta. Each of the 02 shelters served 40 people.
- 34. Centre for mentally retarded children and those suffering with cerebral palsy and associated multiple disorders was started on 8th July, 2000 by IRCS, SPSR Nellore District Branch with 20 students and 5 staff. During the year the number of children rose to 46 in the spastic center.
- 35. Cancer Detection Centre, which began on July 31, 2001, has now grown into a 140-bed Cancer Hospital in Nellore. In the FY 2021-22, 2607 patients were registered. 1016 surgeries were performed, 567 patients were treated with radiotherapy, 4484 patients treated with chemotherapy, and 344 patients treated with HDR and Brachy Therapy.
- 36. To cure victims of dog and animal bites, the ARV Clinic in Nellore was established in 1996. 13 930 people were benefited from this in FY 2021–2022.
- 37. During the year 2021-22 poor patients received free medicines from medicine bank with the help of Sri.C.V.N.Murty, President, C.V.Naga Jyothi Welfare & Service Society, Srikakulam.



38. Due to 'Jawad' cyclone and Penna river flood, 3 districts Nellore, Chittoor and Kadapa were affected in the month of Nov & Dec 2021. APSB provided shelter for the flood victims and provided food, water, milk, medicine to 3000 people. It also distributed 500 dry ration kits with 15 items comprising of rice, dal, tamarind and other required groceries, hygiene kits and blankets to 500 families and served the affected communities in S.P.R.Nellore.

ARUNACHAL PRADESH

A. Celebration of Important Days

The 90th Martyrdom Day of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, and Sukhdev was observed on March 23, 2021, at the State Assembly Hall in Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh, by the IRCS state branch in collaboration with the National Integrated Forum of Artists and Activists, Brahma Kumari's, NBTC, National Integrated Medical Association and the Global Haryana Chamber of Commerce. The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Brig. (Dr.) B.D Mishra participated in the event. The occasion was commemorated by organizing a blood donation camp, where total 232 volunteers participated and 172 units of blood were collected.

World Red Cross Day with the theme #BeHumanKIND was celebrated with destitute and orphaned children of OJU Mission School, Naharlagun on 8th May, 2022. 1300 blankets,201 hygiene kits and 1 month food essential items were donated to OJU welfare Association by the state branch.

B. Distribution of Relief Items

Relief support was provided to the fire victims in Longliang village, Lazu circle, Tirap district, where 80 houses were destroyed and 114 families were displaced on March 18, 2021. Moreover, aid was also given to those affected by a second fire disaster that occurred in the same district's Senua Noksa hamlet on March 3, 2021 and left 40 families homeless.

C. Response to Covid-19

- ➤ IRCS Arunachal Pradesh state branch lifted the dead body of Dr. Gambu Padu, a senior pathologist at Tomo Riba Institute of Health and Medical Sciences, Naharlagun, Arunachal Pradesh who succumbed due to Corona virus. Task was completed under the supervision of Dr. Emi Rumi, Honorary Secretary of the state branch. As a precautionary measures item such as masks, sanitizers, hand gloves and PPE kits were distributed amongst people.
- ➤ IRCS, Arunachal Pradesh State Branch, Naharlagun conducted one day training on Covid-19 Tele Counselling Service at Naharlagun. The training session was divided into two parts i.e. Inaugural and Technical sessions. 25 persons participated in the program.

DELHI

Response to Covid-19

Delhi UT branch undertook extensive awareness campaign for Covid-19 containment, Covid appropriate behavior, vaccination through awareness programs and distribution of IEC material. This was accompanied with distribution of masks and hygiene kits etc.

One of the significant features of the plant is that it has got a refilling unit with a capacity to fill 57 delta type cylinders per day under Indo French solidarity efforts to fight Covid -19.

ECO DRR Project

- IRCS, National Headquarters has awarded ECO DRR Project to be implemented in five selected villages of Suigam Taluka of Banaskantha District. Village Panchayat members and youths have been trained in ECO DRR Programme with emphasize of gram Panchayat Development Plan, Agro Foresting, Peepal Van, Mulching of Soil and integrated Dry Land Forming.
- Gujarat State Branch of IRCS, continued the activities under T.B. Control Project India with the guidance and support from IRCS, National Headquarters. It made all efforts for controlling TB in rural and urban areas of Ahmedabad. Under this project, 500 TB patients were selected. Conducted Volunteer Training Programme for 25 Volunteers. Organized 72 awareness camps in which 6000 people participated. 4 Health Check-up and screening camps were conducted during the year in different villages in which 1450 village people were screened with the help of Taluka Health Officers, RNTCP staff and Private Doctors.





Other Activities

A Physiotherapy Centre is being run by Gujarat State Red Cross Branch, which has been providing quality services to the needy patients at subsidized rates. The Centre has been updated with all the modern facilities including latest laser therapy treatment.

The Senior Citizens are taken for picnic. Weekly medical check-up including eye checkup, dental checkup and ECG are done for all seniors by experienced doctors.

Distribution of relief items

The DM team of Gujarat Red Cross distributed 4520 Hygiene Kits and 99500 Masks to General Public through its District/Taluka branches in the State during the year 2021-22.

Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

- Gujarat state branch has started Health Care Attendance Course which enables young men and women in patient care. This course empowers participants to find employment in patient care.
- > During the year under report First Aid Training Classes were conducted in 60 Corporate Sectors/Colleges/Institutions including Nursing, through which 1520 persons were imparted the training.



From 20th to 26th September 2021 with the guidance of IRCS, National Headquarters, Lay Lecturers' Training was conducted by the State Branch for induction of new trainers and re-examination of existing trainers. 13 candidates participated in the said training out of which 11 cleared the examination.

- Many of the District and Taluka branches regularly conduct First Aid Training Programme in the State. 4843 persons got trained through the training organized by District and Taluka Red Cross branches in Gujarat.
- Gujarat Red Cross organized Basic Life Support Training programme for 6 batches in which medical students, nursing students studying abroad as well as employees of corporate sectors participated in large numbers.
- ➤ The number of Red Cross Branches has been increasing year after year and our target is to form Red Cross branch in each of the 248 Talukas in the State.

HARYANA

Relief Services

Haryana State Red Cross and its District Red Cross Branches provided relief services for the poor and needy persons during 2021-22. Around 18,817 oxygen cylinders have been delivered at the doorsteps of the needy families free of cost. Blood Services

The District Red Cross Branches organized 3968 Voluntary Blood Donation Camps in various districts and collected 2,61,631 blood units during the year 2021-22.





Celebration of World Red Cross Day on 8th May



During the year 2021-22, due to COVID-19 Pandemic protocol, this special day was commemorated at Haryana Raj Bhavan under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Governor-cum-President, IRCS, Haryana State Branch. On this day Hon'ble Governor, Haryana-cum-President inaugurated 70 bedded Covid Hospital at Faridabad virtually. He also unveiled two books on completion of 50 years of Haryana State Red Cross.

Junior Red Cross

The services of Red Cross are carried over in all the schools is called Junior Red Cross services. All the students of 17,300 Govt. schools are the members of Red Cross. Membership subscription is collected from each student at the time of admission. The activities conducted during the year 2021-22 are as under: -

State Level Junior Red Cross Training Camp (For Girls) was organized from 22nd to 28th December, 2021 at Haridwar in which 189 juniors with 36 counsellors from 21 Districts of Haryana participated.





State Level Junior Red Cross Training Camp (For Boys) was organized from 22nd to 28th February 2022 at Punjabi Dharamshala, Kurukshetra in which 207 juniors with 39 counsellors from 22 Districts of Haryana participated in the camp.

Gifts to Juniors- IRCS Haryana State Branch has provided 179 R.O. Water Purifier worth Rs. 35 lakhs, Red Cross Caps, Jackets, Scarfs and Vogals, First Aid & Home Nursing Training to the Juniors in Haryana free of cost through their respective District Education Officers/District Elementary Education Officers.

Youth Red Cross

State Level Youth Red Cross Training Camp (For Boys): - State Level Youth Red Cross Training Camp was organized from 11th to 16th March, 2022 at Punjabi Dharamshala, Kurukshetra in which 107 youths and 10 counsellors from Universities and Colleges of 10 districts of Haryana participated in the camp.

State Level Youth Red Cross Training Camp (For Girls): - State Level Youth Red Cross Training Camp was organized from 23rd to 28th March, 2022 at Nagli Bela Ashram, Haridwar in which 156 youths and 22 counsellors from Universities and Colleges of 10 Districts of Haryana participated in the camp.

Rehabilitation and Physiotherapy Centers

Twelve Rehabilitation Centres are being run by District Red Cross Branches Ambala, Faridabad, Kurukshetra, Karnal, Rewari, Narnaul, Rohtak, Hisar, Jind, Sirsa, Kaithal and Yamuna Nagar.

a) During the year 2021-22, various aids were manufactured in workshop of District Rehabilitation Centres i.e., 323 limbs, 28 brace, 145 crutches, 183 surgical shoes, 387 calipers, 11 collars, 53 splints, 17 jackets, 24 belt, 25 walking sticks, 576 others.

The District Red Cross Branches distributes aids & appliances to the physically challenged persons from their own sources/funds. The State Branch had made a provision of Rs. 13 to 15 lacs for providing appropriate grant to these centres for continuation of the manufacturing of Artificial limbs.

b) Artificial Aids & Appliances were also provided in association with ALIMCO a unit of Govt. of India for aiding the disabled divyangs persons. During the year 2021-22, through the efforts of Red Cross 13,480 Artificial limbs/aids & appliances were provided to physically handicapped persons free of cost through ALIMCO, Kanpur consisting of 973 tricycles, 1,390 Motorized tricycles, 519 hearing aid, 487 wheel chair, 01 motorized wheel chair, 21 blindsticks, 264 walking sticks, 1,327 crutches, 90 Jaipur foot, 84 prosthesis, 183 caliper,997 air battery, 139

MISD kit, 64 smart cane, 29 smart phone, 62 rolator, 46 C.P. chair and 255 other aids amounting to Rs. 9,07,66,515/-

Drug-de-Addiction Centers

Two Drug-de-addiction and Counselling Centers are being run by District Red Cross Branches i.e., Faridabad and Rohtak. During the year 2021-22, Faridabad Centre registered 679 cases and 679 cases were detoxified and Rohtak Centre registered 1129 cases and 621 cases were detoxified.

Family Counselling Centers

Two Family Counselling Centers are being run at District Red Cross Branches Faridabad and Yamuna Nagar. During the year 2021-22, at Faridabad Centre total 127 new cases were registered and 112 cases were closed and at Yamuna Nagar Centre total 97 new cases were registered and 83 cases were closed.

Working Women Hostels

Presently, Four Working Women Hostels are being run in the State of Haryana at Faridabad, Gurugram, Kurukshetra and Rohtak. During the year 2021-22, Faridabad had 31 inmates, Gurugram 42 inmates, Kurukshetra 41 inmates, Rohtak 30 inmates and a total of 144 people were benefitted.

Old Age Home

At present, three old age homes are being run at Ambala, Panchkula and Panipat. During the year 2021-22, there were 27 inmates at Ambala, 27 inmates at Panchkula and 08 inmates at Panipat old age home and a total of 62 inmates were benefitted.

Services for the Mentally Retarded

School for Mentally Retarded Children, Faridabad: The branch has started a project "School for Mentally Retarded Children" in a joint venture with Rajasthan Association, Faridabad at Sector-14, Faridabad for the Mentally Retarded Childrens. All the facilities are being properly given to MR Children's to stand by their own and perform daily routine works so that others may not feel them as Burden. The expert/specialized staffs have been dedicatedly performing duties. During the year 2021-22 total 22 MR Children are availing the facilities from this school.

Mental Health Care Centre, Faridabad: - The Branch has also started "Mental Health Care Centre" in a joint venture with Faridabad Industrial Association, Faridabad at Sector-14, Faridabad. The centre is providing the health checkup and provides different therapies, counseling to improve them in all aspects. During the year 2021-22, 882 persons were benefitted by availing this facility.

Arpan Institute, Rohtak: - The key function areas of the institute are modes of care, training and rehabilitation, development of human resources and information, guidance, and consultancy to other organization in the field of mental retardation. Arpan has extended its services at block levels at Kalanaur and Sampla. Every year 140-150 mentally retarded Children benefited from these services in which 30 children are provided residential facility.

Sharvan, Rohtak: - Sharvan is the first unique center of its kind in the State of Haryana & in Northern India, the only one in the country being run by the Red Cross Society aimed to provide life care facilities to its inmates i.e., mentally challenged adults. Presently, 35 Mentally Challenged (13 residential & 22-

day care setup) Adult persons are getting training.

Early Intervention Programme at Hisar: - The main aim and objective of this programme is to encourage and acquisition of new skills by the child to minimize the effects of handicapping condition to accelerate independent functioning of the child and to render assistance of parents in coping skills and understanding their child better. During the year 2021-22, total 24 children were benefitted from this facility.

Family Welfare Centers

These centers are being run in 7 Districts i.e., Fatehabad, Jhajjar, Narnaul, Panipat, Rewari, Sirsa and Yamuna Nagar. During the year 2021-22, total 964 sterilization cases were handled through these services.

Hospital Welfare Services

These services are provided in all the districts for the patients. Free medicines are provided to needy patients where help comes from nowhere. During the year 2021-22, a total of 3,186 awareness camps, 1,368 health checkup camps, 4,31,133 patients checked, 20 patients helped from CM Relief fund, 28,440 patients received help from Diagnostic centers and 6,412 patients admitted in 141 hospitals in HUDA land.

M & CH Centers

Presently, Four Maternity Child Health Centers are being run by District Red Cross Branches i.e., Jhajjar, Panipat, Sirsak and Yamuna Nagar. During the year 2021-22, a total of 1,045 Vitamin solution was distributed, 522 BCG, 2,018 DPT/Penta, 1,199 MMR Measles cases were handled and total 176 Deliveries were conducted.

Targeted Intervention Programme (HIV/AIDS)

Targeted Intervention Programme (HIV/AIDS) initiated for spreading awareness about this life-threatening disease. During the year 2021-22, a total of 6,801 female sex workers were identified, 832 IDU were identified, 19,255 HIV testing were done, 26,959 Regular Medical checkups were done, 28,47,715 condoms were distributed, 34,372 Individual counseling sessions and 1,733 group meeting were conducted.

Rain Basera (Night Shelter Homes)

During the winter season all the District Red Cross Branches provided free night shelter homes through its 30 centers. During the year 2021-22, 4,836 homeless persons were benefitted.

T.B. Project

TB Project is now implementing for retreatment of most vulnerable TB patients in all the District Red Cross Branches in Haryana. During the year 2021-22, 5,865 Patients were pursued for treatment.

Membership

During the year 2021–22, a total of 5,654 Red Cross Members have been enrolled through which an amount of Rs. 18,65,450/- have been collected and Rs. 13,68,900/- have received through Donation.

HIMACHAL PRADESH

The Himachal Pradesh State Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society has always been on the lookout for sick, needy, and helpless people. Some of the activities on the agenda of H.P Red Cross include financial assistance for poor patients' treatment, the operation of Ashrams and residential homes for destitute/orphan children. The branch is proactive in organising blood donation camps, ambulance services/relief/free medical checkup camps/donate artificial limbs/financial assistance to the poor, and so on.

A. Blood Services

IRCS operates ten Blood Centres throughout the state. Karnataka Red Cross Blood Centre, Bangalore is one of the major blood banks in the state with component separation facility having 100% voluntary blood collection. Annually around 35,000 blood units are collected, processed, and issued to the needy patients of Government Hospitals as well as blood storage centers. 619 Voluntary Blood Donation camps have been conducted and 20609 blood units were collected during this period by Karnataka Red Cross Blood Centre. 32 Mega Blood Donation Camps were conducted during the period 2021-22.

National Voluntary Blood Donation Day was observed on October 1st, 2021, at Indian Red Cross Society, Karnataka State Branch. The programme was inaugurated by Sri Krishna Byre Gowda, Former Minister of Rural Development, Law and Parliamentary Affairs and Agriculture. Sri Gopal B Hosur, I.P.S, (Retd.,) was the guest of Honour. Sri S. Naganna, Chairman, IRCS, KSB presided over the function. On this occasion top 10 Institution / Organizations who have supported IRCS-KSB to organize voluntary blood donation camps were felicitated for the outstanding efforts exhibited by these institution/ organizations in promoting voluntary blood donations during the year 2020-21.



NAGALAND

The year 2021 provided the Indian Red Cross Society Nagaland (IRCSN) with another opportunity to provide humanitarian assistance to the poor and oppressed. This was made possible with Government of Nagaland's unwavering support and the regular flow of funds.

- During the 2021-2022 the IRCSN State Managing Committee met 10 times, conducted 4 quarterly meetings, 3 Emergency meetings and 3 Sub-Committee meetings.
- > The IRCSN launched a campaign to promote the use of face masks in all churches, mosques, and public gathering places in Kohima, Dimapur, Mon, and other areas.
- The hearse was donated by Sh. Neiphiu Rio's, hon'ble Chief Minister of the state. The hearse was flagged off on April 7, 2021. The hearse proved to be of great use to the populace as many people used it to travel from Kohima to a variety of locations, including Mongsenyimti, Hongphoi, Longmatra Village, Meluri town, Pughoboto town, Khazhakeno, Imphal, Tobu town, Kiphire, Viphoma village, Tinsukia, Wokha town, etc.

Meetings



- A meeting of all District Secretaries was convened on July 13, 2021, at the Red Cross Conference Hall to discuss the Covid 19 pandemic and its implications for prevention and care. The 40 oxygen concentrators received from the National Headquarters were distributed to all district branches.
- The <u>Annual General Meeting (AGM)</u> was held for two days w.e.f. 16th and 17th Nov 2021, at Kohima. The first day for Business Session and the second day Ceremonial function at Raj Bhawan where the Hon'ble Governor of Nagaland and President of IRCSN Prof. Jagdish Mukhi addressed the auspicious occasion.

Other Activities

> IRCSN's provision of ambulance services to patients in dire need is one of its major contributions. In this regard, IRCSN has three ambulances operating and serving patients in Kohima, one of which is a BLSA from NHQ.

International Federation of Red Cross Society (IFRC) has sanctioned one video conference facility for the state. This became functional in March 2022.

Tour & Visit

Beginning on February 21, 2022, the IRCSN State Headquarters hosted a tour programme to visit the district branches. Dr. Neiphi Kire, Gen. Secy, Dr. R. Rose Chakhesang, M. C. Member, and others served as the team members. The following districts were visited by the team: Tseminyu, Wokha, Mokokchung, Longleng, and Mon. Meetings were held with the Red Cross volunteers and the Deputy



Commissioners and officers. Distribution of blankets, hygiene kits, masks, and other items were also organised.



The IRCSN State Headquarter team along with Mrs. Abeni TCK, Chairperson and other members visited old age home and AIDS hospital at Kohima where Mink blankets, hygiene kits, face masks were distributed to the inmates.

Some of the activities at the districts are highlighted below: -

Mokokchung district branch

- 8th of May 2021: Volunteers from IRCS Mokokchung district Branch in commemoration of World Red Cross Day distributed 2000 nos of 3 Layered Surgical Face Masks at Mokokchung Town.
- In commemoration of National Voluntary Blood Donation Day, IRCS Volunteers participated and donated blood at Blood Bank Mokokchung.

• The District Branch is continuing to provide Hearse Services at Mokokchung. Currently, the Hearse Vehicle is stationed at the COVID 19 Hospital and is providing free services to the unfortunate persons dying from the disease.

Peren district branch

- On receiving information about fire incident at Jalukie town effecting 9 (nine) households, the IRCS team from Peren visited the victims family on 27th September 21 and gave relief items like blankets, kitchen sets, mosquito nets, T-Shirts, soaps, rice and other food items.



TRIPURA

A. Response to Covid-19

- ➤ 25 of the 40 oxygen concentrator machines received as gift from the Oppo cell phone company were handed over to the Tripura Medical College authorities for the Covid-19 patients admitted in the said Hospital which was declared as the dedicated Covid -19 hospital of Tripura.
- All the District Red Cross offices are provided with 2 oxygen concentrator machines each for local use, free of any cost after circulating detailed guidelines.

Emergency usage of the Oxygen concentrator machines was allowed free of any cost for the people living within the city limit of the Agartala Municipal Corporation and thus saved lives of umpteen people, which was an unprecedented support in the face of Covid -19 crises.



Door to door medicine service, Sonamura

- ➤ Very large number of reaching out activities were carried out to the people in distress with supply of face masks, sanitizers, hygiene kits, hand washing soaps, sarees & dhotis, plastic buckets and blankets across the state.
- > Two special programmes of outreaching works were carried out for exhorting the cremators working in the Crematorium of Agartala city for their services at the time of acute distress due to Covid-19 pandemic.
- At our request the Assam Rifles jointly held a programme with us for reaching out to the people at Khilpara under Gomati district to support villagers in distress due to Covid-19.
- The State Branch floated Expression of Interest seeking applications from the wards of the Covid -19 orphans of the families belonging to the marginalized section of society for continuance of their studies till the level of graduation or for a period of 5 years, whichever is less in collaboration with the TataAIG General Insurance Company. It is a first-time initiative of the Tripura State Branch.

B. Celebration of Important Days

The Red Cross Day and the International Day of Yoga were celebrated by the Tripura State Branch on the two designated days in a befitting manner after observing restriction norms/ formalities etc of Covid-19 protocol. H.E. Governor of Tripura [President of the State Branch] kindly issued Message to the people on the solemn occasion of the Red Cross Day.

C. Blood Services

- ➤ One Blood donation camp has been organized at Sonamura under Sepahijala District in the month of June, 2021.
- Organized voluntary blood donation camp at Ramthakur Seva Mandir, Ram Nagar Rd. No. 4 where 27 units of blood were collected for eventual transportation of collected Blood.
- > Organized motivational Camp on voluntary blood donation at Ambedkar College located at Fatikroy, near Kumarghat in collaboration with Youth Red Cross (YRC) Unit.

D. Capacity Building Activities and Trainings

- The State Branch has also decided to arrange training in association with the Indian Medical Association (IMA) Tripura State Branch of the First Aiders (Female & Male) to develop trained manpower for every Gram Panchayat of Tripura as per directives received from the NHQ. Development and deployment of this trained manpower in course of time is expected to change the health care scenario of the State for ever. This initiative is also unique and being implemented for the first time in Tripura.
- > The State Branch has decided to declare the Maiganga Gram Panchayat under the Khowai district to be the Red Cross village for its adoption as a model for providing critical health care as per norm on receipt of confirmation from the IRCS (NHQ)
- In association with the District Administration of West Tripura a mock drill was organized for rescue to safety & security of the people in the event of earth quake at Agartala, Mandwi& Belbari This was accompanied with first aids training.
- > During Durga puja festival roadside camps were organized at Agartala to provide relief and first aid to the pilgrims visiting puja pandals.
- Organized free health camp and volunteers services round the clock during Diwali Mela at Matarbari temple complex, Udaipur.
- ➤ Completed the task of repairs/ maintenance and development of the conference hall located in the 2nd floor of the Red Cross Bhavan at Agartala out of funds received from the ONGC, Tripura

E. Distribution of relief items

- Distributed blankets and bedsheets (100 each) to the Orphan children of Anneweshaa Child protection centre at Usha bazaar Agartala on the 15th December, 2021.
- All the 7 District Branches have also carried out similar reaching out programme under their respective jurisdiction for amelioration of the people in distress.

UTTARAKHAND

A. Response to Covid-19

➤ In the remote areas of Pithoragarh district, the distribution of relief supplies and oxygen concentrators was held from 24th Aug- 26th Aug 2021, in accordance with the directives issued by the Chairman of the Managing Committee of IRCS Uttarakhand State Branch for containing the spread of the Corona virus. Hygiene kits, kitchen sets, masks, soaps, and blankets were distributed amongst needy and vulnerable.







Evaluation and Progress Report of Maternal and Child Welfare Hospitals - The Mother and Child Welfare Hospital operated by the IRCS, NHQ, New Delhi is presently operated in Chamba district, Tehri Garhwal and Nagthat district, Dehradun. The distribution of material and the progress report of the work done by the personnel working there to prevent corona virus infection is as follows. Apart from this, Bal Vikas Kendra is operated in Narendra Nagar and Korba. Vaccination work is being done in Nagthat and Chamba by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned district. Number of beneficiaries in Chamba, Tehri Garhwal- 19992 and approx. 1500 at Nagthat district, Dehradun.

B. Blood Services

- > 08 th May, 2021 a blood donation camp was organised by the state branch at Hindu National School Laxman Chowk, Dehradun.
- The state branch organised a blood donation camp on September 27, 2021, at 23 Field Regiment Clementown Dehradun Cantt. 104 units of blood were collected and delivered to Dehradun's Doon Hospital. Blood donors were given certificates and hygiene kits.
- On 16th November 2021 a blood donation camp was held at Dev Bhoomi, Uttarakhand University, in which 105 units of blood were donated by the students.



C. JRC/ YRC activities

- As desired by Indian Red Cross NHQ, New Delhi and instructions given by Honorable Governor to speed up Youth Red Cross activities, the state branch in correspondence with the Uttarakhand government on 31 Aug 2021 required for formation of Red Cross in Higher Educational Institutions Instructions were given to set up Youth Red Cross units in all the universities of Uttarakhand state.
- On August 31, 2021, the state branch wrote to the Uttarakhand government requesting the establishment of Red Cross units or chapters in all of the state's higher educational institutions. This request was made in accordance with instructions from IRCS, NHQ, and the Hon'ble Governor of the state to expedite Youth Red Cross activities. Government College Gopeswar organised the Youth Red Cross programme by creating the unit there.
- > Due to the lack of a warehouse for storing relief materials belonging to the IRCS, Uttarakhand state branch, the branch has requested funds from the NHQ for the construction of its warehouse.

The NHQ support for construction of the multipurpose warehouse was on the condition that the site area be 330 cm, and approval for 50 lakhs was received from NHQ New Delhi on the condition that NHQ contribute 90 percent of the total cost and the state of Uttarakhand contribute 10%. The construction will cost 45 lakhs. It should be noted that till date 80 percent of the warehouse construction work is nearly completed.

D. Distribution of relief items

Blankets received from the Indian Red Cross, NHQ New Delhi, were sent to various districts to protect them from the cold wave, with the intention that they would ensure distribution of blankets to the needy and helpless people through Red Cross volunteers

and members. The details of the material sold in the districts are as follows.



The blankets received from the IRCS, NHQ, New Delhi were sent to various district branches with an intention that they would protect the needy and vulnerable from cold wave. The detail of the materials that were sent for distribution are; 2947- woolen blankets, tarpaulin- 149, towel- 75, saree-74, bed sheets-50, gents dhoti- 65, mosquito

nets - 150, buckets- 60, surgical masks- 94330, gowns- 3760, goggles- 10, oxygen concentrator- 69, oximeter- 255, thermal gun- 255, sanitizer-600 and gloves pairs- 1850.

- Due to heavy rain in Nainital and Udham Singh Nagar, many families were severely affected and were left homeless. IRCS Uttarakhand state branch provided relief material to the needy and vulnerable.
- ➤ To maintain coordination and cooperation with the district committees, the district branch Pithoragarh sub-committee visited Munsiyarl, Nainital, Udham Singh Nagar, Pauri, and Tehri and distributed relief material. Meetings with the office bearers were held to promote JRC/YRC activities.

➤ Distribution of 130 blankets in Nari Niketan on 04.01.2022 and on 19.01.2022. Distribution of blankets to 48 families of Mental Hospital Selaqui Dehradun and Aamwala area.

E. Other Activities



The Uttarakhand state branch established a <u>video</u> <u>conferencing facility</u> with support of IRCS, NHQ, New Delhi. Online meetings with the District Secretaries and the Chairman of the state branch were set up. The NHQ occasionally holds online meetings in addition to this.

- ➤ Jan Aushadhi Kendras are being run by the district Red Cross branch; Dehradun, Pauri, Garhwal, Almora, Pitthoragarh, Bageshwar and Uddham Singh Nagar. Currently there are 19 kendras.
- Basantotsav was celebrated at Raj Bhawan, Dehradun, Uttarakhand from 8th to 9th March, 2022.
