This month we held IRCS, State/ UT Branch Leadership Meeting in virtual mode on 18th Nov, 2022. The focus subjects in the meeting were to review the status of Leprosy & TB eradication initiative, review the status of the delivery & utilization of the vehicles provided to the branches & purchase of Blood Centre equipment for equipping existing blood centres and new blood centres.

Based on the meeting I would like to point out that few branches have already sent the Action Taken Report. The branches which have not sent the report yet should send it ASAP.

I urge the branches to collect data on Lepers & provide it to NHQ so that a data bank can be created. The branches may also add a capsule on First Aid to Lepers in the existing First Aid & SERV curriculum.

The next review meeting will be held towards the end of December 2022 or during the first half of January 2023.

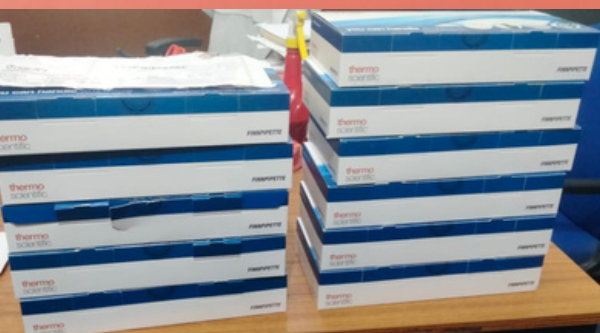

### IFRC support for strengthening the IRCS Blood Centres

In an appeal raised by IFRC, around INR 164 Crs. meant for IRCS for Covid-19 response was received by them. A part of this fund is being used to provide equipment to strengthen 97 existing Blood Centres and 22 new Blood Centres in different states. The State/UT branches were consulted for the locations of 22 new Blood Centres. The list of 20 new blood centres, which are ready to install the equipment, has been sent to IFRC. Information for rest 2 blood centres is awaited from state branches and would be sent to IFRC immediately on receipt. In order to ensure that there is no breakage and the equipment are made operational at site, these equipment will be provided and installed by the supplier at the final destination. Some of the equipments which would be provided to blood centres are refrigerators, BCM, tube sealer, ELISA set, donor couch, refrigerated transportation boxes.





# Meetings of IRCS, NHQ

## State/ UT Branch, Leadership Meeting



The meeting of the State/UT Branch leadership was held in virtual mode on 18th Nov 2022. Secretary General thanked all Branches for their active participation in the 2 day “Chintan Shivir” on 22nd & 23rd September 2022 at New Delhi. He expressed his pleasure as branches supported concrete decisions with timeline on various subjects. The status report on Leprosy & TB eradication initiative was discussed. Several branches are taking initiatives to find donors to support these patients & some branches are also supporting the patients from their own resources. The status of the delivery & utilization of the vehicles provided to the branches was also reviewed. It was also decided that one capsule on dressing for Leprosy patients should be included in the first aid training curriculum.

**The Meeting of the Procurement Committee** was held on 9.11.2022. For obtaining technical advice special invitees were requested to participate. After long deliberations the committee approved the agenda, items which included Renewal of agreement for supply of surplus plasma to the fractionators for one year at the same rate as of previous year and the committee firmed up the final revised NAT specification based on the observations of Global Advisory Panel for installation of NAT technology in IRCS, NHQ, Blood center.

During the month of November, the NHQ held meetings with J&k, Manipur, Uttarakhand, Andhra Pradesh, Meghalaya, Bihar, Jharkhand, Goa, Chandigarh, Puducherry, Chhattisgarh & Tamil Nadu State branches for **Reconciliation & settlement of working Advances to the branches**. This is needed to ease the process of releasing the project funds to the branches.



A meeting was held on 16th Nov 2022 to **review the utilization of funds received** for the Covid pandemic. HOD, IFRC, Mr. Udaya Regmi along with his colleagues also participated. The status of utilization of funds, supply of different kinds of vehicles, and blood center equipment supply, were reviewed. As few branches are now not ready to receive the blood center equipment. The branches which are ready to receive the equipment has been requested to submit their need.



**A Workshop on Disaster law & Legislative Advocacy in South Asia & Enhancing Resilience in South Asia through Disaster Law** was held on 19th - 24th Nov 2022 at Male, Maldives. It was organised by IFRC & hosted by the Maldivian Red Crescent. Deputy Secretary, IRCS, NHQ, Sh. N.K Singh along with Mr. Ahmad Obaidus Sami, Program Coordinator, South Asia Regional Delegation at IFRC attended the workshops. The focus was to train the participants of the National Societies on advocacy strategy, analyze the national disaster laws of the countries in the region & look for opportunities of working together on new threats. Along with the National Societies officials of the SARCC countries also participated.

## Umeed ki kiran.....A ray of hope



Andhra Pradesh Red Cross team visited Palutla, tribal hamlet in Nallamala reserved forest in Yerragondapalem Mandal in Prakasam district. They traveled 50 Kms inside the deep forest from Yerragondapalem. It took them 4 hours to reach there. It was a challenging trip, as there were no proper roads and it was in a dense forest. There was only one solar lamp in the entire hamlet, where the team stayed. The team of volunteers, including the Andhra Pradesh state branch Chairman, Dr. Arumalla Sridhar Reddy, slept in the Red Cross tents and they took bath, shaved and brushed in the waterfalls. They provided 200 kitchen sets, each worth Rs 10,000 (containing 30 items), hygiene kits, tarpaulins, blankets, sarees, dhotis, footwear and many more items to the vulnerable and needy. They also conducted a mega medical camp, including dental, & provided medicines. 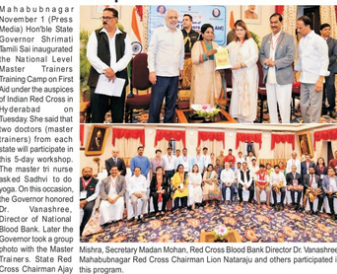
